The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Shelby Jett Jr.
request for reinstatement.

A letter was read to the faculty from Shelby Jett, Jr. who in November last was suspended from the college for an indefinite period; on account of participation in the disturbances of Halloween night. He asked to be reinstated, stating that his part in the disturbances referred to were free from evil intent, and tendering apologies for what had occurred, with promise of correct conduct in the future.

This application was accompanied by a letter from Mr. J. Embry, Allen, his attorney in the trial following his arrest, which urged a favorable consideration of Mr. Jett's application.

Upon motion of professor Neville seconded by Prof. Norwood. it was ordered by an Aye and No vote that Mr. Jett be reinstated.

Upon motion of Prof. Anderson, seconded by Prof. Miller, it was ordered that a com. be appointed to consider this matter and report to the faculty. Pres. Patterson appointed upon this com. the Deans of Courses of Study.

The faculty met in called session, those present: Pres. Patterson, professors James G. White, Patterson, Pryor, Anderson, Matthews, Miller, Pence, Burrill M. White, Wilson, Tuttle, Grubbs, G. K. Chapman, Rowe and Frankel.

Mr. G. K. Chapman appeared before the faculty upon the charge of attempting to cheat on an examination.

Prof. Tuttle stated that at the close of the Fall term, he noticed soon after the exam. began, that Mr. Chapman was acting peculiarly, and upon going to him found him with cards containing notes evidently prepared for the purpose of aiding in an examination.

Mr. Chapman in response admitted that the charge was true, protested that he was sorry he had done it, and that he would never again be guilty of such an offense.
