Diplomacy expands in Mideast crisis

JERUSALEM —Palestinians and Israelis exchanged gunfire yesterday, hours before the deadline on Israel's ultimatum to the Palestinian particular and the palestinian leader yasser Arrafat, in a meeting with Egyptian President Hosni Muharak, said he would limit his talks with U.N. Secretary-General Kofi Annan to Palestinian demands for an international inquiry of the events of the past 12 days that have left 88 people dead, most of them Palestinians. The U.N. Security Council has called for an "objective inquiry," but stopped short of Arafat's demand for an international commission. Israel has rejected both calls.

U.S.-born West Bank settler dead

JERUSALEM — An American-born Jewish settler found dead in the West Bank was apparently on his way to a Jewish shrine being ransacked by Palestinians when he was seized and killed by Palestinian militants, Israeli police said yesterday. The New York Times said the victim, Hillel Lieberman, was a second cousin of Sen. Joseph Lieberman (Connecticut, the Democratic Party candidate for vice president. The senator's spokeswoman, Kelly Moore, issued a statement saying the senator was not aware of any relationship.

EU lifts Yugoslavia sanctions

LUXEMBOURG — The European Union reached out yesterday to the new democratic Yugoslavia, lifting an oil embargo and other sanctions and promising help to revive the moribund economy. But the EU foreign ministers who met here left aside uncomfortable questions about how to deal with former president Slobodan Milosevic and his legacy. The United States, which has its own sanctions in place against Yugoslavia, also has promised to roll them backbut it has yet to do so.

HUNTSVILLE, Ala. — The bottom fell out of thermometers yesterday with temperatures hitting record collegees from Mempas was Piorida, including readings at the freezing point as far south as Alabama, where the temperature in Huntsville dropped to 29 degrees. Record books were rewritten in Georgia, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Missouri, Nebraska, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and West Virginia, the weather service said. Record lows were tied in New York, Arkansas, New Jersey, and Virginia.

FBI: we need Cyber ethics education

WASHINGTON — The Justice Department and the Information Technology Association of America, a trade group, has launched the Cybercitizen Partnership to encourage educators and parents to talk to children in ways that equate computer crimes with old-fashioned wrongdoing. FBI agents are spreading a new gospel, hoping that they'll better educate youths that vandalism in cyberspace can be economically costly and just as criminal as mailbox bashing and graffiti spraying.

Germans may ban political party

BERLIN — Intent on standing tough against neo Nazis, Germany's top law enforcement official said yesterday there is enough evidence to seek a ban on a far-right party accused of fanning racial hatred blamed for recent attacks on foreigners and other minorities. Such a move would be the toughest step yet in efforts by German leaders to stem a series of attacks this year that included the fatal beatings of an immigrant and two homeless men as well as arson attacks on synapogues.



'Tired of being the bad guy': Police use play dates to stop neighborhood crime

REDLANDS, Calif. — Four-year-old Angela Valdez peeked out from behind her mother, eye ing the police officers as they rolled into her neighborhood with six police cars and a SWAT bus.

Had they come again to take somebody away for something bad—drugs or guns?

No, her mother said, they came to play with her.

"She didn't believe it," Angela's mother, Sonya Valdez, said recently, "To her, the ploic take people away — arrest them."

them."

But week after week, members of the Redlands Police Department came, bringing toys, games and snacks as part of a first of its kind policing program aimed at reducing crime through prevention.

Bueermann. "I wanted a way to serve the public in a more deeply meaningful way. It had to be about more than enforcing the law and arresting people."

The weekly play dates are the latest addition to Redlands' Risked Focus Policing program, which uses statistics — compiled from school, hospital and police records — to target areas in the San Bernardino County city where residents, particularly children, have the highest exposure to drugs, gang violence, poverty, domestic instability and other factors long believed to play a role in criminal behavior.

JERUSALEM — Palestinians and Israelis exchanged gunfire Monday, hours before the deadline on Israel's ultimatum to the Palestinians to end the violence or face "forceful" action. World leaders stepped up their efforts to stem the crisis.






