Dear Wife

I write these few lines hoping they will find
you and little Eli and my little blue eye baby
all enjoying good health as leaves me at
present thanks be to the great God for all
i am on the the land of the living where there
was thousands of my my fellow soldiers were
layin dead and wounded there was an awful
sight to be seen the monday after the battle
by eye witness of sum of our own men there
were three rebels killed to every one of ours to
be seen lay ing on the ground the monday morning
after the battle if i was shot there you never
should hear any account of me more than i was
among the missing whether i was shot or
taken prisoner he cans it was after noon
Sunday when i found the Regiment and there
never a man went out of our company to
look for the other three that was on guard ride
close to where i was i hope if i should get
a shot that i will be able to struggle away my
self i dont know how soon i will have to go
to the field to fight
