

Wallace Wilkinson says he expects a big boost in his Democratic campaign ment by the 31,000-member United Mine Workers.

"It will mean a lot in money and votes. They have a good organization, and they're active," Wilkinson said Wednesday after receiving the endorsement from the UMW political action committee, which was recommended by all eight of the union's area councils in Kentucky.


