BOYD CIRCUIT COURT

The plaintiff, Sam Porter, states that on the 17th of January, 1923, he was the owner of 350 shares of stock in the Porter Mining Company, a corporation, duly created, organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the state of Kentucky, and that on said date he entered into a written contract with the defendant, Dr. M. M. Collins, in words and figures, as follows, to-wit:

"This contract, made this 17th day of January, 1923, between Sam Porter, of the first part, and Dr. M. M. Collins, of the second part,

"WITNESSETH: That first party is now the owner of Three Hundred and Fifty (350) shares of the corporate stock of the Porter Mining Company, a Kentucky corporation; that first and second party hereby agree to put a price on same of Thirty-eight Thousand Three hundred and Thirty-three (\$38,333.33), Dollars and Thirty-Three cents, in consideration of which, and inconsideration of the further sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar cash in hand paid to second party, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, second party hereby agrees that he will buy said stock from first party, if offered at said agreed price one year from this date, provided first party can transfer same unincumbered and vest second party with a good title to said stock.
