The Lexingtion-Fayette Urban County Planning Committee
approved a proposal Friday to replace some abandoned warehouses on South Broadway with five apartment buildings that
could house about 900 students in 332 apartment units.
The apartments will be set up in three to four-bedroom
units, each with its own bathroom, said former Lexington mayor Jim Amato, a lawyer representing the developers. The complex will have central meeting rooms as well as workout rooms
with full equipment, a studio for movies holding 25 to 30 people,
swimning pools and basketball courts, he said.
The 825 to \$30 million project will include vinyl and brick
buildings with two or three stories to be completed by 2005.
The apartments are only a few blocks from campus, so Amato said he is concerned with pedestrian safety.
"We will not proceed with the project if we aren't able to
get students safely to campus," he said.
Currently, approval for a pedestrian and cycling bridge is
being discussed with Norfolk Southern Railroad.
Since the apartments will be housing many students, the
neighbors are concerned with the change in atmosphere within their neighborhood.





UK Student Government's 2003-2004 budget turns the tide from last year's big spending on parties and concerts. 25,000 went to last Thursday's Gator Roast 2. The budget allocates \$11,500 more to student organizations, \$5,000 more to SG's public relations department and adds three \$500 scholarships for SG members.

The \$278,801 budget was passed by the SG Senate 27-1 on Sept. 10. The budget cuts entertainment funding by 44 percent and staff spending by 47 percent.

President Rachel Watts said she overestimated most expenses to avoid repeating last year's deficit of \$12,881.

WEDNESDAY

University Health Services, which serves students, faculty and staff, is asking for more space for exam rooms and other services, the Kernel reported.

Julie Bentley, interim associate director of the service, said students often wait too long or can't get an appointment soon enough.

"As enrollment has increased we have found that our critical schedules fill up regularly on a daily basis," she said.

The service has about 14,000 square feet at its location in the Kentucky Clinic, said Pat Terrell, vice president of student affairs. She said the service needs at least 34,000 square feet to operate at an optimal level.

THURSDAY

While UK Parking and Transportation Services continues working to relieve campus parking woes, they are selling more than twice as many Koto parking permits as there are actual spaces in the lot, the Kernel reported.

For the 2.778 spots in Koto, 5.659 permits were sold for this semester. There is no limit on how many Klot passes are sold every semester, said Don Thornton, director of Parking and Transportation Services.

Thornton said that because parking services is entirely self-supporting, funding for new parking accommodations int coming easily. The department is still paying down debt on two projects totaling \$27 million, he said.

Courts, council should consider business rights

The Kentucky Court of Appeals breathed new life into the case of opponents of Lexington's smoking ban on Friday. A three-judge panel ordered an injunction of the ban, which would affect all restaurants and bars in the city, until the full court examines both sides of the debate and rules on the law.

History is rife with examples of restaurant owners being forced to adapt to laws aimed at protecting customers. For example, restaurant owners can't use absets on the walls. They have to adhere to strict health codes that are enforced by random health department inspec

These regulations stand on solid legal ground, so similar rules governing public smoking are certainly reasonable as well as legal. Second hand smoke, like asbestos, is undoubtedly a

health hazard.

But as it stands now, the ban would outlaw smoking in all restaurants and bars, period. With a little effort, officials could write a new

law, giving some concessions to both sides.

First of all, smoking should be allowed to continue in bars. Adult non-smokers are quite

capable of weighing the option of staying away from a smoky environment against their desire to go out to a bar.

Also, there's no chance of a young child being forced to endure second-hand smoke by a bad parent, since we've yet to see a bar in Lexington that welcomes infants.

Also, it would be reasonable to allow smoking to continue in establishments that gain most of their revenue through food service, if the restaurants adhere to strict guidelines.

Officials could establish rules requiring smoking sections be a certain number of feet removed from the entrance of a restaurant and the non-smoking section.

The city could require that these sections be

The city count require that these sections be walled off so that customers in the smoking section won't be bothered by the habits of smokers. It's always strange to see a restaurant with a non-smoking section in the back, forcing non-smokers to walk through a haze of smoke in order to reach their counts. der to reach their seats.

Restaurant owners would be given the option of adapting to the regulations or going smokefree. Since their gripe seems to be that profits would drop in the event of a moking ban, they could choose to update their facilities to make up for that perceived loss of funds.

If the issue is truly the health of non-smokers, such a compromise should leave both sides of the debate pleased.


Smoking ban protects the public health

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government in June 2003 voted 11 to 3, with one abstention, to enact the prohibition of smoking tobacco products in all enclosed public places, with some exceptions.

The ordinance is now being challenged in court and implementation has been temporarily stayed.
Reasons for such a law:
1. Protect the public health — scientific evidence has accumulated in the last decade that overwhelmingly confirms that passive smoke is harmful and dangerous.

Passive smoke can trigger an acute asthma attack and chronic exposure increases the rate of respiratory cancers. For centuries governments have exercised police powers of quarantines, compulsory vaccinations and even additives for water to prevent tooth decay.

2. For areas with smoking bans in place, a review of receipts as reflected in lax records shows increased revenues for restaurants and only temporary decrease in bars.

3. Compliance has not been a problem in the jurisdictions with bans as it tends to be policed by concerned citizens.

4. The majority of Lexington-Payette Urban County Council believes the right to breathe clean air transcends the right to smoke in public places.


