OCLC ACQUISITIONS SUBSYSTEM

On November 11 and 12 Gail Kennedy attended a workshop on the OCLC Acquisitions Subsystem held at SOLINET Offices in Atlanta. The workshop provided hands-on experience with the subsystem, which includes both ordering and fund accounting.

The Acquisitions Department will be learning how to use the Acquisitions Subsystem in the next several weeks and will begin testing the system in the near future. Full-scale transition from BATAB to OCLC for Acquisitions would not occur until July 1982, at the earliest. Acquisitions staff will give demonstrations of the OCLC Acquisitions Subsystem in the next few months and also provide training sessions for other campus libraries who are interested. Training sessions for other libraries in Kentucky may also be offered next year. All of these will be announced in the GREEN BEAN.
