Computer mailing lists have plethora of options

Most students are content with sending one-line, trivial e-mail messages to their friends, but for those who desire more stimulating discussion, UK offers listservs.

Listservs are simply mailing lists where a group of people from around the world communicate on a particular topic via e-mail. From fly fishing to bluegrass music, students, faculty and staff have a variety of subjects to choose from.

Computer science junior Bijoy T. George has been on the NeXT computer mailing list for two years now. thing risqué on our host," Collins said.

Listservs work in two ways.

First, the un-moderated list allows users to send messages as-is to everyone subscribed to the list. Moderated list messages may undergo editing before being sent to others.

Collins said the number of subscribers to each list can range from a few to a couple thousand.

UKCC is not the only way to access these lists. In fact, about 85 percent of mailing list subscribers use accounts other than UKCC.






