One firefighter died and another was seriously jured while fighting a blaze at a vacant house

One firefighter died and another was seriously injured while fighting a blaze at a wacant house early yesterday.

Charles H. Williams Jr., 29, was pronounced dead at the UK Medical Center at 1-41 a.m. Gerald Ray, 31, was admitted to the hospital and was in serious conditions with burns.

Authorities said Williams and Ray walked in the front door of the house and immediately fell through to the basement, where they were trapped for about 20 minutes. Efforts to revive Williams were unsuccessful.

UK senior basketball player Derek Anderson pleaded innocent on charges of running a red light and driving with a suspended license yesterday morning in Jefferson County District Court. He spent two hours in a Jefferson County jail.

Anderson, a 6-foot-5 guard who has been out with a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee since Jan. 18, was arrested at approximately 4 a.m. yesterday by Jeffersontown police.

He was released on his own recognizance. He is due back in court March 12.





Unions may return in newspaper strike

DETROIT — The last of the striking unions at Detroit's daily newspapers formally offered yesterday to return to work, giving the publishing company five days to end the 19-month-old walkout.

The Newspaper Guild, representing striking reporters and editors, faxed its unconditional offer to Detroit Newspapers Inc., joining truck drivers, printers and other production workers in the maneuver.

"Well have to sit down today and decide what to do," said Tim Kelleher, senior vice president for labor relations at the company that runs business and production operations for The Detroit News and the Detroit Free Press. "When the time is appropriate, we will be sitting down with the unions."

Newspaper officials have five days to respond now that all the offers are in. But disputes, including whether the strike is over unfair economic practices or economics, are expected to day on for months in the courts

or economics, are expected to drag on for months in the courts

regardless of what the newspapers do.

"If these are, indeed, unconditional offers, then this strike is legally and officially over. It is our position that if the unions contend that they are still actively on strike, that there are legal ramifications which must be considered," the company said in a statement.

If the newspapers reject the offer, the unions say they will ask the National Labor Relations Board to seek a federal injunction to immediately return them to their jobs.

Newspaper officials have said they do not intend to fire the 1,300 replacement workers hired during the strike, and would only allow strikers to return to work as jobs became available.

But NLRB regional director William Schaub said it would be improper to take back only some workers.

"In an unfair labor strike, the strikers are entitled to their jobs back even if that means firing the replacements," said Schaub, whose ruling that the newspapers committed unfair labor practices is under appeal.
