#### MONDAY

UK's enrollment is now larger than ever, and black freshman enrollment is up by 30 percent from last year, the Kernel reported Monday Total enrollment at UK is about 35,000, including about 8,600 Lexington Community College students, according to UK's Fall 2008 Enrollment Report, released Sept. 12.

Black student enrollment reached 200 this fall. up from 150 last year, bringing total black enrollment to about 2,600, or about 7.5 percent of UK's enrollment.

"The increase in African-American enrollment encourages me that we can do better in this area," Don Witt, who is director of undergraduate admissions and university registrar, told a Kernel reporter.

#### TUESDAY

Amidst a student protest outside, the UK Board of Trustees decided Tuesday not to mine coal in the UK owned Robinson Forest, on the basis of a report commissioned by President Lee Todd and put together by four administrators.
"I have no interest in proposing coal mining in the Robinson Forest. I think the focus should be on the environment," Todd said at the board's meeting.
Many supported the coal mining because proceeds would have gone to the Robinson Scholars program, which gives scholarships to first-generation students from Eastern Kentucky.

#### WEDNESDAY

More than 20 people spoke up at Wednesday's LexTran board meeting, asking the transit service to keep its buses safe and fix existing safety issues, the Lexington Herald-Leader reported.


