The faculties of the Civil and Mechanical Engineering Courses reported to the general faculty that Cadets J. H. Kehoe, F. D. Siebert, and C. C. Shepherd had submitted, during the examination in calculus, papers of marked similarity.

The Board of Discipline reported after a consideration of the facts that fraud had been practiced and recommended the cases to the consideration of the faculty.

Mr. Shepherd came before the faculty, and stated that he and the others, accused, had frequently worked together, that they did so on the evening previous to the examination, that they had worked on three or four questions given on the examination, that they had talked about the second question but had not fully worked it out. He could give no reason

for the similarity in the papers. He denied any knowledge of fraud during the examination.

Mr. Kehoe was then admitted to the room. He denied any knowledge of fraud. Mr. Siebert denied any knowledge of fraud.

After statements from each of the Cadets they were excused from the room.

Prof. Miller offered the following:

That Messrs. Kehoe, Siebert, and Shepherd be dismissed if found guilty of cheating on the examination - seconded
