

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE
Nov. 20, 1933

The University Senate met in Room 111 McVey Hall Monday, November 20, with President McVey presiding.

The minutes of October 9 were approved as read.

The following recommendations of the Committee on Duplication of Work were approved:

New Course:

Anthropology and Archaeology 105. Ethnology. A lecture course on the Living Races of Man. The supposed origin and known migrations of the present ethnological groups; their relationships, geographical distribution, cultures and religions. Three hours per week. Two credits. Prerequisites: Junior standing.

Changes in Courses:

Political Science 171a. Political Theory from Plato to Bentham. Three credits. The political philosophy of Plato and Aristotle; Roman political thought, the political theories of the Middle Ages, the Renaissance and the Reformation, Bodin; Grotius; More; Bacon, Harrington, Filmer, Locke, Hobbes, Spinoza, Montesquieu, Rousseau, the Federalist Papers, and the English Utilitarians.

Political Science 171b. Political Theory from Bentham to Present. Three credits. The political theory of constitutional democracy, the rise of socialist political thought, the historical school, the organic theory of the state, theories of nationalism, imperialism and internationalism, pluralistic theories of sovereignty, facism, anarchism, syndicalism, guild socialism, and communism.

Note: 171a, b are to replace 171 (3 credits) and 102a, b (2 credits each).

Law 176. Trade Regulation, Oliphant's Cases. Contracts not to compete at common law. Competitive Practices; intimidating and molesting; unfair practices; unfair advertising; combinations. The Federal Statutes and the N.R.A. legislation. Two hours credit. Daily. Summer Session, 1933. Professor Evans.

Law 177. Statutory Interpretation. & Sloovere's Cases. Judicial Notice; Process of Interpretation; subject matter and purpose of the statute; context; associated words; extrinsic aids; relation to other statutes and to the common law; mandatory and directory provisions; operation; effect; repeal. Two hours credit. Daily. Summer Session, 1933. Professor Murray.

Law 178. Creditors' Rights. Hanna's Cases. Enforcement of judgments; fraudulent conveyances; general assignments; receivership; bankruptcy; assets; distribution. Three hours credit. Daily. First Semester. (Substitute for Law 146 (bankruptcy). Professor Roberts.

Petitions for new organizations, recommended by the University Council, were approved as follows:

- The Hort Club - Honorary horticultural society
- Phi Epsilon Phi - Honorary botanical. To be petitioned for a charter by the Rafinesque Club.
- Delta Kappa Alpha - composed of members of DeMolay

Dean Jones presented the social calendar for the year, and on motion it was voted to accept the recommendation of the University Council that this matter be referred to the Dean of Men and the Dean of Women with power to act.

President McVey stated that several members of the faculty had attended meetings of organizations in which they were interested, such as the Association of Land Grant Colleges and the National Association of State Universities. He suggested that it would be a good thing for these persons to make a report to the Senate of the proceedings of those meetings. It was voted that the Secretary make arrangements to have such reports made from time to time at meeting of the Senate.

President McVey announced the November convocation for 10 a.m. Tuesday, the speaker to be Professor Dengler, Director of the Educational Institute of the University of Vienna.
