he has utterly neglected to attend to them.

He has affected to render the Military independent of and hither swarms of Officers to harass our People, and eat out their substance.

He has kept among us, in times of peace, Standing Armies without the Consent of our legislature.

He has affected to render the Filitary independent of and superior to the Civil Power.

He has ombined with others to subject us to a jurisdiction foreign to our constitution, and unacknowledged by our laws; giving his Assent to their acts of pretended legislation:

In every state of these Opression We have Petitioned for Redress' in the most humble terms: Our repeated Petitions have been answered only by repeated injury. A Prince, whose character is thus marked by every act which may define a Tyrant, is unfit to be the ruler of a free People.

Nor have we been wanting in attention to our British by their legislature to extend an unwarrantable jurisdiction over us. We have reminded them of the circumstances of our emigration and settlement here. We have appealed to their native justice and magnanimity, and we have conjured them by the ties of our common kindred to disavow these usurpations, which, would inevitably interrupt our connections and correspondence. They too have been deaf to the voice of justice and of consanguinity. We have the energy of the world for the rectifude of our intentions, doe in the necessity, which denounces our Separation, and hold them, as we hold the rest of mankind, Enemies in Warr, in Peace Friends.

We, therefore, the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress, Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectifude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare. 
