The Report of Prof. Peace of Committee on Dormitory is
taken up for consideration. Prof. Council moves to
amend. Amendments accepted. The Report and Recommend-
ations having been read as amended, it is moved and
seconded that they be adopted by the Faculty and submitted
to the Executive Committee for approval. Carried. —
Prof. White of Committee on Revision of Course of Study
reports. There are to be four courses, v. Classical scientific
agricultural and engineering. After viewing the schedule
as drawn up on the blackboard in Prof. White's room,
the report is adopted with some minor changes as to
modern languages and on motion it is resolved to
recommend it to the Executive Committee for approval.
The question having come up, whether it is advisable
to send an official representative of the A. M. College,
to take part in the Oratorical Contest to be held this
summer at the Chatauga meeting here in Lexington,
the question is decided in the negative.
