

SEEING SPORT STUFF

It's the eve of the annual football struggle wherein Kentucky's Wildcats stage their annual attempt to beat two foes in a single afernoon—Alabma's big Red Tide and the forces of Fortune. It is usually quite a battle, but only once has Kentucky been a winner, and the 'Cats have had 15 chances. No matter how you figure it, the Alabama-Jinx combination has a terrific edge in the victory department.

Whoever penned the line "hope springs eternal in the human breast" must certainly have envisioned Kentucky fans in relation to the Alabama situation. Since 1922, just few years after the Armistice was signed, the Bluegrass has patiently awaited another conquest of the apparently relentless Crimson Tide.

Now the years have piled on each other-and we face the same problem tomorrow as has confronted us for so long. Hundreds of eagerly-expectant homecomers are already pushing into town for the week-end, hoping to be on hand when we finally arrive at a definite conclusion with Alabama—by handing them a setback, preferably a convincing one, but yet a setback.

And their hopes should be fulfilled.

Here's the conversation taking place between your re-

Here's the conversation taking place between your reporter and an imaginary — but persistent — interviewer whose name might be Waldo. And these are the questions most fans will be asking or will be wanting to ask today and tomorrow.

Q. Do you think Kentucky has a chance to win against Alabama?

A. Yes, Waldo, we think the Wildcats have a good chance to win tomorrow.

Q. Yeh, but that's your trouble—you're always saying that Kentucky can win. What makes you think so this

that Kentucky can win. What makes you think so this time?

A. Shall I name all my reasons? Yes? Well, I'll tell you. In the first place, regardless of any other considerations, the Wildcats have just as good a ball club as the Alabamas this year and we haven't always been able to say tha, you know, Waldo. In fact, I must say that I think this Kentucky team is superior in ability to the Tide.

Q. That's all very well, but what about the rest of the reasons?

A. I'm trying to get along as fast as I can, Waldo. Sorry if I'm elemental. But, to continue, you know this game will mean more to us than any other with the probable exception of Tennessee. Well, the boys realize it, too, and they're going to be out there scrapping every minute tomorrow trying to take that ball game. Besides they have the added incentive, if it is necessary, of wanting to avenge the Georgia Tech lacing. Alabama is the first really tough opponent we have met since then and the 'Cats will be wanting to take out a little of the revenge on them.

Q. Well, that's all very nice and quite logical, too, but give us a little more convincing proof. How has the team been looking in practice this week?

A. Ah, Waldo, that's the question I've been wanting you to ask. And here's the answer. Observers who put in a lot of time over at the practice field during the fall, have been heartened by the work of the squad this week. I'd say that the club was blocking and tackling better at this moment than at any time this season. Now doesn't that make you feel better? It should, as the Wildcats' weakness previously has been blocking and tackling—the fundamentals department.

Q. Now how about the Kentucky hospital list, which includes "Bullet Bob" Davis, probably the main scoring threat in the 'Cat offense, and Wendell Skaggs, one of the regular tackles?

A. You've got me there, Waldo. I don't know much more about it than you do. Skaggs is definitely out of tomorrow's action, though. As for Bob Davis, I'm not sure. According to our very latest information, Davis will don a suit but is not expected to take part in the festivities.

Who is scheduled to start in the Wildcat ball-carry

Q. Who is scheduled to start in the Wildcat ball-carrying roles?

A. Coach Wynne has not announced his lineup yet but we're figuring on Elmore "Red" Simpson at quarterback, Dameron Davis and Bert Johnson in the halfback slots and Walter "Whirly" Hodge, the Paris sophomore, in the fullback berth. Tommy Coleman may start instead of Bert Johnson at one halfback, but I think it will be Bert.

Q. Now, in conclusion, tell me who can carry the ball for the Tide?

A. They tell me, Waldo, that this guy Joe Riley is still working out with Frank Thomas' club and if you'll remember he did a fair job of running with the leather up here two years ago. He's plenty fast and plenty shifty. And then the Elephants also have another boy named Calewell—they call him Blackie— who has been doing a lot of damage to opposing lines this fall. These two boys stand out in the Tide's attack but they've also got a few others who take their turn on ball-toting excursions. However, I don't think Alabama will turn up this season with another one of those devastating Howell-to-Hutson passing combinations. If they should, I'll take back all my predictions.

Q. Well, Joe, you seem to be so certain that the Kentuckys are going to win, how about making a little wager?

A. Okay, Waldo, and "Il go the limit. Consider yourself indebted to me to the extent of one of Miss Hoover's thirty-five cent luncheons, and I'll be around to collect it Monday.

Whereupon, Waldo, once more happy, and knowing all the answers, leaves the office, smilling.

All that remains now is to send the football visitors away just as happy and we'll consider it as a highly successful week-end for all concerned.

It won't be "wait t'il next year," this Saturday night—but, "By gosh, the boys finally turned the trick and beat Alabama."

Boys, don't let me down here.
