Courses, changes
in ~~Course~~ Rules
regarding.

President Patterson called attention of the faculty to the rules relative to changes in a student's course in college (see page 145) and to the fact that this rule had been overlooked, and not enforced.

Upon motion of Prof. Kastle seconded by Prof. W. K. Patterson it was ordered that existing cases i. e. cases which have arisen during the present college year, - of shifting of courses in violation this rule, be referred to Com. consisting of the Deans for adjustment.

Adjustment of
Courses in Physics
and Elect. Eng.

A communication from Prof. Peuce to the president was read by the latter, this letter being with reference to the adjustment of certain lines of instruction related both to Physics and Electrical Engineering, concerning which some misunderstanding exists between the Departments of Physics and Mech. Engineering as to the character of instruction given and by whom it should be taught.

After several motions with substitutes and amendments had been proposed, it was finally ordered upon motion of Dr. Pryor that this matter should be referred to Prof. Anderson and Prof. Peuce for adjustment.

Proposed organization of new literary society

Pres. Patterson appointed Prof. Matthews, White and Peuce.
