REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE.

"1. In case of incomplete work, what report should be made to the registrar?

(1) The committee recommends that a condition be given in the subject, or the student's grade be lowered, at the discretion of the instructor.

2. When a student is absent from an examination without just cause, what report should be made to the registrar?

(2) The committee recommends that he be given a failure (E) in the subject.

3. What should be done when a student drops a subject, particularly when he does so to avoid failure?

(3) The committee recommends, in case a student drops a subject without the permission of his dean, he be suspended for the remainder of the semester. A student who is absent from a subject for one week without just cause, shall be considered to have dropped that subject.

It is the sense of this committee that all faculty rules relating to the conduct and standing of students be collected and printed semi-annually, and a copy be given to each student when he matriculates at the beginning of each semester, and a copy be sent to each instructor."
