In a previous guest editorial we attempted to show that a second medical school was badly needed in the State of Kentucky. The Medical Advisory Committee to the Governor's Legislative Commission recommended in December 1953 that more help be given immediately to the medical school in Louisville so that this school could educate more students but that a second medical school be built at UK as soon as financially practicable.

We stated that the number of physicians in this state has been steadily declining since 1910 and that the deficit will be serious by 1965.

To build and maintain a medical school any-Leo Chamberlain is chairman has made a careful study of the whole problem and has come up with a figure of \$15,731,000 which would be the cost of the first nine years.

This would make the average amount per year for the building and maintenance about \$1,730,000. They estimate the annual cost of maintenance after the first six years of building, at \$859,000. Of this \$15,731,000 between five and six million would-come from federal aid under the Hill-Burton Xetf and the rest from the state of Kentucky by act of the Legislature.


