Wilder voted off court for breaking SAB rules

The Student Activities Board called an emergency meeting vesterday to investigate allegations that Royalty Court nominee Carrie Sterling Wilder used illegal advertising in her campaign.

"We regret that we had to disquality Carrie Sterling Wilder from her candidacy for homecoming queen based on violation of rule number three set forth regarding the Royalty Court," said SAB Vice President Winn Stephens.

Wilder, candidate for Delta Gamma social sorority, said last night she is appealing the ruling. She said she has hired a lawyer to investigate her options.

"Right now we are going to try to work it out through the administration, and, if necessary, we'll take it to court," Wilder said.

She said she thought SAB did not have the required quorem present at the emergency meeting as called for in its by-laws. Rule number three of the Royalty Court rules and regulations state that "any banner, poster or flyers seen on University of Kentucky's campus will be grounds for immediate disqualification."

Stephens said only personal advertisements in Kentucky Kernel and personal campaigning for the Royalty Court are allowed.

Panel evaluates relevance of UN

Korappath said that while problems do exist, U.N. programs like the World Health Organization and the International Monetary Fund make the U.N. indispensable for developing countries. The solution, she said, is to dispel the egocentrism and the pessimism.

"On the one hand the U.N. has been increasingly receiving criticism from its dubious peace keeping operations to its counterproductive development laws; from its superior security council veto to the egalitarianism of the General Assembly" Korappath said. "On the other hand, thera been a host of rarley published, silent successes."

Arben Ahmetaj represented Albania, the U.N.'s

Arben Ahmetaj represented Albania, the U.N.'s mallest member, and talked about the economic changes resulting from the intervention of the IMF and the World Bank in 1991. Since that time, Ahmetaj said, Albania has shifted to a market economy where individual businesses thrive.

Libya, a nation disdained by many U.S. citizens, has gained independence through assistance from the U.N., said Tahreer Gaeidi.

Gaeidi's main concern, he said, was the selective enforcement of human rights policies outlined by U.N. officials. He called for a more inclusive definition of a human rights violation and terrorism to "deal with the issues with the same language."

The Cats (10-3-2) will take on the Commodores (9-7), a team with which UK is all too familiar.



It's been more than two and a half years since the world heard anything from Counting Crows.

Lead singer Adam Duritz even asks the question, "Have you seen heartely." in the seventh track of the new album.

"I was out on the radio starting to change! somewhere out in America it's starting to rain/ could you tell me things you remember about me and have you seen me lately."

The new album is a departure from the mellow sound of August and Everphing After, which sold 6 million copies worldwide.

From the opening chords of "Catapult," you get a sense that these guys are serious about creating a new image.

"Angels of the Silences" is an example of their livelier sound. During the opening seconds of the song I wondered if this was actually the Counting Crows. But once the whiny voice of Duritz kicked in, I realized that the band from San Francisco can rock.

Though the album is livelier than their first, elements of the stat album still come through in

songs like the title track and "Goodnight Elisabeth," a slow song about dependence on a woman that Duritz used to date. "I woke up in pieces and Elisabeth had disappeared again? I wish you were inside of me/ I hope you're resting okay."

The highlight of the album comes in the song "I'm Not Sleep-ing," in which the band uses string arrangements to create a fuller sound. The song starts off with a slow beat but quickly picks up the tempo, and I ended up swinging my arms like an orchestra conduc-tor.

The strings are used throughout the album, but unlike many
bands who use orchestras gratuitously, the Counting Crows make
the arrangements work for their
songs in a sentimental and meanionful way.

"Miller's Angels" is a great song in which Duritz seduces the listener with a piano while using one key as an exclamation point to tell people to leave him alone.

The Wurlitzer organ comes into play for "Another Horse-dreamer's Blues." This song makes me see myself in a smoky lounge somewhere as the guys play to their hearts' content about a girl who has no place in the girl who has no place in the orld.

The album ends on a somber

and sweet song about leaving someplace instead of staying. Bottom line: This album is well worth the two-and-a-half-year wait Counting Crows fans have been enduring. The band shows solid growth in its writing and playing, and now they've made me anxious for their next release.



Student designs new class

An innovative new course will be offered to students this spring, founded and designed by UK stu-

founded and designed by UK students.

Houston Combs, a finance sophomore, submitted the idea for the course, tentatively called HMN 300, in response to a contest chaired by Ray Betts, director of the Gaines Center, and by UK sophomores Andy Grotto and Lori Watson.

Combs proposed a course that focused on how other nations see Americans.

"We want to examine the sentiments of other nations in regard to the actions the U.S. takes to protect its own interests," Combs said.

Betts met Grotto and Watson during their freshman year and helped them organize the course design contest.

"He (Betts) was our UK 101 professor, and we just really hit if off. We stayed in contact, and late last semester we just happened to come up with this idea," Grotto said.

Their idea was to sponsor a contest for sophomores to design a course with an international, multi-disciplinary topic.

"In other words," Grotto said,
"it had to be able to be broken
down into several varying subtopics about other nations."
Judging the proposals were
Grotto and Watson, as well as
G.M. Newton, athletic director;
Paul Willis, director of libraries;
and Dr. Stemple, dean of the Patterson School.
Grotto, Watson, and Betts
chose the judges because of their
rebistics to lend a good perspective

"Houston's idea was the best
one," Grotto said.
The eight-week, pass/fail class
will be worth one credit hour.
The class will met Mondays and
Wednesdays from 4 to 5 p.m. in
the Gaines Center.
Only about 10 or 15 students
will be allowed into HMN 300,
but any undergraduate can apply
by writing an essay on why he or
she is interested in the class.
Grotto emphasized that students shouldn't take this course as
a major requirement. They should
have a genuine interest in international views and opinions of the


