Profs preach prudence

Forum: Four professors from regional universities discuss historical perspectives surrounding terrorist attacks

Many Americans have come to a con-sensus, supporting retaliation against those responsible for the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks.

Four professors from regional univer-sities attempted to challenge this consen-sus at a forum Tuesday night.

The consensus is "based on ignorance, misinformation, and double speak," said Paul Lewis, a UK graduate student.

The idea of "they attacked us, so we attack them; is the kind of "stupidity that has led to events such as the attacks of six six attack them; at the attack of six six said.

"While we can't understand attacks such as those on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon, we can try to under-stand the social forces behind them and try to formulate a long-term response," said Nayef Samhat, a Centre College gov-ernment and international studies profes-

War: Red Cross buildings hit by U.S. airstrikes

KABUL. Afghanistan — U.S. strikes set Red Cross warehouses afire near Afghanistan's capital Tuesday, sending workers scrambling to salvage desperately needed relief goods during a bombardment that could be heard 30 miles away.

During afternoon U.S.-led raids, at least one bomb exploded in the compound of the International Committee of the Red Cross at Khair Khana near Kabul. Anthrax: Campus postal workers examining thousands of pieces of mail each day for suspicious packages, envelopes

After two weeks of anthrax scares in Kentucky, the UK post office is taking its time to ensure that students and faculty do not receive any packages or letters containing the deadly bacteria.

Each of the thousands of pieces of mail received by the post office each day is being examined for any suspicious signs of anthrax before being shipped to the campus buildings, said Venda Riegway, the manager of UK Postal Services and Duplicating Services and Duplicating Services and return address, stam deaders and the services and return address, stam from the time they were sent out to when

they were received and any form of powder.


The 24 staff members have met several times within the past two weeks, Ridgeway said.
Workers have been briefed at each meeting of the U.S. Post Office's guidelines for working with suspicious mail. "We are making sure our staff has been educated with it." Ridgeway said.

Ridgeway said four envelopes without return address-se were found this morning and went up for further investigation among staff. All were found safe.
Ridgeway said if a package with anthrax is not detected, the departments receiving the mail are trained to catch it. She said the UK post office is not responsible if something does slip hrough. said.

She said work is going on as usual, but the increased awareness of suspicious packages is causing minor delays in delivering mail around campus.

"We are very aware of what is going on and we are thinking of the safety of employees, staff and all of our customers," Ridgeway said.

The KCCRIS communicates with national agencies involved in clinical research and directs faculty to the resources necessary to conduct

Belinda Smith, senior clinical research coordinator for KCCRIS, said volunteers should know they have a choice to participate but should not feel pressured to.

"Anyone volunteering is and should be completely informed of the benefits, risks and alternatives." Smith said.



In all actuality, the attack on Afghanistan is triggering a backlash throughout the Muslim world that is giving birth to more terrorist atacks. This attack has been one of the best recruiting tools for militant anti-Western terrorist groups.

People are protesting the U.S. bombing of Afghanistan in major cities throughout the world.

"The horrible events that occurred at the World Trade Center and the Pentagon simply can't be corrected by killing more people and dropping more bombs," said Walter Lippmann, a citizen of Los Angeles.

"Conventional war cannot overcome terrorism and defeat terrorists, it can only result in innocent people becoming victims," said Malaysian Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad.

In Egypt, around 10,000 students protested at universi-ties around the country, some of the protesters calling for jihad, the Islamic word for a holy war.

In New York, Sergi Ershou, a naturalized citizen from the former Soviet Union, said the bombings were pointless because the people responsible for the Sept. 11 attacks are already dead. "I don't think military action can achieve anything. It will be a war with ghosts," he said.

The United States told the United Nations that its military campaign may be broadened to encompass more than Afghanistan. U.S. Arab allies have warned Bush that expanding the military campaign beyond Afghanistan would turn the tide of public opinion in their countries. Iran has warned America and Britain their aircraft will be attacked if they stray into Iranian airspace in their operations against targets in Afghanistan.

In quick summary, we can look forward to more terrorist attacks, the death of more than 100,000 Afghan children and a large-scale holy war with the Middle East.






