

My dear Son.

Frankfort 14th Oct. 1845

I came down here yesterday, and shall not return until the day after tomorrow. Before I left here, I ascertained that your note at the N. Bank was not due until the 17th and I deposited your note for its practical renewal, which I have no doubt will be done. At the Branch B. I requested Mr. Pindell to pay your note out of my funds, or let it lie over until my return, which he said he would do. Your business therefore will not suffer until I get back, when I suppose I shall receive from you your bill on P. & H. which I had returned for your signature.

I wish you would say to Mr. Smith that I sent a Barrel of old Bourbon to his house, thro' the Rail Road, which I wish carefully forwarded to Dr. H. S. Levert of Mobile free from expense to him. I wrote to him ^(Mr. Smith) about it by Dr. Marshall.
