

Louisville December 17<sup>th</sup> 1845

My dear Brother

I take the pleasure to write to you. we are all very well. I hope this will find you well too. I hope they are all well up there. you must excuse me for not writing to you before, because I have not had a good pen. I have not got rid of my cough yet. how is Nannette Marshall? Aunt Tamar is very sick. I have got up to tunes. I take music lessons three times a week. I am learning very fast both French and music. I am very sorry that I have not written to you before. Brother Johnny says he wishes to see you very much. I don't think Father is going to New Orleans. Father says he does not wish to go. Father eat so many oysters the other night that he made himself feel very badly. ask Nannette Marshall how her doll is coming along Tell Grandpa that I want to see her very much. I wish to see you very much and all up there. - Every one in the house has a bad cold. I am very sorry that Grandpa is going to New Orleans. Uncle Smith and Cousin Nannette, Mr Bryant Brother Johnny and I send our love to you and all our relations at Ashland
