Students divided on proposal

UK's name on degree meaningful for some

Editor's note: The following is the second story in a four-part series that takes a closer look at the post-secondary education changes Gov. Paul Patton bas submitted to the Kentucky General Assembly for the May 12 special legislative session.

Mary Hoskins and Roberta Hickman are as divided on the community college issue as UK President Charles Wethington and Gov. Paul Patton.
Hoskins, a single mother who graduates with an associate's degree in nursing this May, said the school's tie to UK is a lifeline, affording them amenities that suit Hazard students who cannot go away to

school.

"The UK emblem lends prestige to the degree," Hoskins said. "Nobody would recognize Hazard Community College. What is that?"

"I attend the largest community college in the state." she said. "There are community colleges out in the state that have TVs and VCRs in every classroom." The lack of communication between UK and the town's corporations harts graduates seeking jobs, said Dennis Richardson, a political science and communications major at Somerset Community College.

"A student may go six months without finding a job and might end up at Wal-Mart," he said.

In Patton's proposal, three-fourths of the new board consist of business leaders, while the student, staff and faculty representatives each get half a vote. Emphasizing "work force development" in education deprives students of the chance to develop their minds, said Pam McLaughlin.

"I'm very, very concerned that in all of his initiatives, he never uses the word 'education," said McLaughlin, an associate professor of biological sciences at


STATE U of L drops remedial ed

LOUISVILLE — The University of Louisville plans to drop remedial education as part of an agreement with Jefterson Community College, which would assume the duties in a partnership hailed by a lawmaker. Under the agreement, Uoff. will grant full admission to most of the academically weak students who now receive provisional admission.

Instead of taking remedial classes for no credit, as they do now students will be assigned to special sections of introductory English and mathematics at Uoff. These classes will carry full credit but will offer students extra help and more time, to complete work.

"Essentially, it means that we are getting out of the remedial education business," Uoff. President John Shumaker said last week, JCC would take on the job of remedial education for students who were denied admission to Uoff...

LOUISVILLE — Concerto is George Steinbrenner's designated hitter for the Kentucky Derby — and the colt has earned his way into the lineup.

Despite being unbeaten in four starts this year and the winner of seven of 10 races, Concerto's Derby status was still in doubt even after he won the Jim Beam on March 29 at Turfway Park.

Now he is considered a leading contender for the 1 1/4-mile Derby, which is expected to have 12 starters Saturday at Churchill Downs. Pulpit, the Blue Grass winner, was the 5-2 favorite, followed at 3-1 by Captain Bodgit, winner of the Florida Derby and

Wood Memorial.

The big Derby hope for Steinbrenner, owner of the New York Yankees, was Acceptable, who was beaten by a short neck by 2-year-old champion Boston Harbor in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile on Cet. 26 at Woodbine.

"After the Jim Beam we were pointing toward the Derby, but it was still possible we weren't going to come," trainer John Tammaro said. "If Acceptable had won the Blue Grass, we might have gone to the Tesio and then to the Illinois Derby."

Acceptable finished second in the Blue Grass on April 12 at

Acceptable finished second in the Blue Grass on April 12 at Keeneland, staying in the Derby picture, but then on the morning of April 19, he broke a bone in his left foreleg during a workout at Keeneland. That afternoon, Concerto won the Federico Tesio at Pimilico for his fifth straight win dating to a second-place finish to

Captain Bodgit in the Laurel Futurity on Nov. 2.

Concertor started his winning streak in the Kentucky Jockey Club on Nov. 30 at Churchill Downs. The only Derby horse to have raced at Churchill Downs is Celtic Warrior, winner of an allowance race Nov. I and second in the Jockey Club.

"He hasn't gotten the attention all along that he deserves," Tammaro said. "But in all fairness we didn't take the traditional route with him."

While Acceptable, trained by Nick Zito, was sent to Florida for the Fourtain of Youth and the Florida Derby, Concerto opened his 3-year-old campaign by winning the Whirlaway at Aqueduct, then went to Turfway Park for the Battaglia and the Jim Beam.

"We weren't going to go head-to-head with Acceptable," Tammaro said. "If you're a nowner you don't want to run against yourself."

Actually, Acceptable also is owned by Robert Clay, who bought a 55 percent interest from Steinbrenner earlier this year.

INDIANAPOLIS — Indiana Pacers president Donnie Walsh is assembling a list of possible coaching candidates, although he won't contact any of them until he hears from Larry Brown.

Brown, with two years left on his contract with the Pacers, is expected to decide this week whether he will return. Walsh has said he won't hold Brown to his contract if he wants to leave.

"I've told Larry we can't wait forever, because we have to get another coach," Walsh said.

"I'm trying to accommodate him. I'm not trying to do anything that will hurt him. We've never asked Larry to leave; he has to make that decision."

If he goes, one possible replacement is former Phoenix Suns coach Paul Westphal, who said Monday night he would be interested in coaching the Pacers.

Westphal, who played 12 seasons in the NBA, was

Another possibility is former Boston Celtics star Larry Bird, who met with Walsh over the weekend.



LANDOVER, Md. - Add the Washington Bullets to the long list of teams that have faced this proposition in the NBA playoffs: Find a way to stop Michael Jordan

would serve as a showcase for the young, improving team.
Instead, Washington has thus far done little more than allow Jordan to add another memorable playoff performance to an already expansive archive.

After a routine 29-point effort in Game 1, Jordan scored 55 points on 22-for-35 shooting Sunday in a 109-104 victory that gave defending champion Chicago a 2-0 lead in the best-of-5 series.

The Bulls can close out the first-round playoff series tonight at the USAir Arena — unless Washington finds a way to stop lordan.

"We'll make a couple of adjustments, but he made it happen," Bulless coach Bernie Bickerstaff said. "We had two or three different hands on him — he didn't get very many uncontested shots — but you have to send him to a rare of the court where he can't make passes."

Working mostly against Calbert Cheaney, Jordan reached the 57-point plateau in the playoffs for the fifth time. The most remarkable aspect of the effort was that Cheaney and the Bullets harassed Jordan during all 44 minutes the superstar was on the floor.


"The defense was good; he was just that much better," Cheaney said. "I did what I could. When a player gets in that zone and the min is looking as big as it was for him, there's nothing you can do."

While it appeared as if Jordan seemingly abandoned the Bulls' triangle offense in order to work a little 1-on-1 magic, Chicago coach Phil Jackson insisted that the All-Star guard merely improvised while working within the parameters of the system.

"The triangle offense is an offense that creates spacing and an overload," Jackson said. "If Alickon said. "Michael played perfectly within the bounds of what the offense has to offer."

Jordan has scored 50-plus points in successive playoff games only once — in a 1988 first-round series against Cleveland. He's 34, and the Bullets can only hope that two days of rest isn't enough for him to fully recover from Sunday's intense workout.

"I think the Bullets have it right," Jackson said. "If you want to beat the Bulls, you want to hake Jordan have take a lot of shots and have to carry the load because, evertually, he's going to wear down. 'Scream' to close for comfort

Even though Screamers was a minor money-making film for Sony Pictures Entertainment while in theaters, the film promises to rake in large sums of cash thanks to Miramax.

After much debate over Mirama's decision to use the title Scream for its hit comedy/horror,

Sony won a judgment Friday from an MPAA arbitration that orders Miramax to stop using the title immediately—or face a heavy fine. As of 5 p.m. last Friday, Miramax became obligated to pay Sony a fine of \$1,500 per day per screen. Scream was on 1,216 screens, so that totals more than \$1.8 million per day; Scream grossed \$1.4 million this past weekend.

And since Screamers grossed less than \$6 million in its 1996 release by the Sony-owned Triumph, Scream fines would exceed the film's gross in about four days. Miramax plains to file for a court injunction.



Madisonville Community College. "He's misplacing his analysis of the problem."

The problem, she said, lies in the value Kentuckians place on a college education — none. McLaughlin said legislators do not give the community colleges

enough funding for new academic programs, nor do they allot enough for UK to do research. She said the community colleges do not hurt UK's mission to be a top-20 research institution.

"We haven't reached that (status) because the citizens do not value education yet," said McLaughlin, who agrees with Patton that the colleges' "need better coordination" and vocational programs need stability.

Citing results from studies done by the Pritchard Committee, which helped draft Patton's proposal, she said about six universi-

ties teach German, but only nine students total got degrees in German. The administrative structure of the vocational system, the study found, has been changed three times in the last 10-15 years.

HCC business administration freshman Mark Sheperd said he likes Patton's idea to remove the Council on Higher Education and install a more effective body.

The rest of the plan, however, does not allow many options when changing jobs, he said.


