Fields, now 37, was the keynote speaker Wednesday at Worsham Theater to kick off the month-long celebration of Lexington's Fields and Heritage Festival.

"He was an excellent speaker. He spoke to the kinds of principles and values that are influenced by this festival," Grundy said.

Colombia — Police raiding a warehouse in this rural town stumbled upon a 100-footlong, half-built submarine they say would have been able to ship up to 200 tons of ocaine below the ocean's surface. The submarine's discovery marks a new chapter in innovation for Colombia's drug cartels, which have previously used refitted commercial airliners and oceangoing freighters to ship cocaine.

"It shows what our students are learning, and I think it will help the newspapers of the future when we see them graduate and go on to full-time jobs," he said.




