Nov. 20th

The Faculty met as usual at 12 o'clock.

The members of Club No. 5 were present to account for some shooting around their quarters. The matter was soon explained satisfactorily and the case was dismissed. Maj. Stoltz stated that the Regent wished to have that club broken up as it was small and caused considerable trouble. Maj. Stoltz was authorized to make such a disposition of the Club as he should deem best. Mr. Bachelor was arraigned again on the same charges as at the previous meeting, the President not having considered his offenses sufficient to justify him in sending him home, as the Faculty at the previous meeting had authorized him to do.

Mr. B. was required to pay his debt for boarding, to enter the "two-hours" department, and resume all of his

duties immediately. The general conduct of Messrs Potter and Howell was reduced 50% each, for fighting. A letter from Mr. L. O.
