- ✓ Physical Education 21 - Calisthenics and Gymnastic Stunts. 2 hrs. recitation, 8 hrs. lab. 4 credits (One semester)
- ✓ Physical Education 22 - Football. 2 hrs. recitation, 8 hrs. lab. (one-half semester); 2 credits.
- ✓ Physical Education 23. Track. 2 hrs. recitation, 8 hrs. lab. one semester. Four credits.
- ✓ Physical Education 24. Boxing and Wrestling. 2 hrs. recitation 8 hrs. lab. one-half semester. 2 credits.
- ✓ Physical Education 25. Football. 2 hrs. recitation, 8 hrs. lab. one-half semester. 2 credits.
- ✓ Physical Education 26. Community Recreation. 2 hrs. recitation, 1 hr. lab. 2 credits.
- ✓ English 15. Oratory. Two hours a week. 2 credits each semester. Changed to English 15a and 15b. Oratory. Two hours a week 2 credits.
- ✓ Education 103. Book Selection for Children and Young People. Same as English 28. 2 credits.
- ✓ Education 111. Cataloguing and Classification for the School Library. Same as English 27. 2 credits.
- ✓ Education 112. General Reference Work. Two credits. Same as English 25.
- ↓ History 170. The Era of Louis XIV. Prerequisite, one year of European History. Three hours a week. One semester. (Note: This is to be given in the Summer Session as History S170, with two hours credit)
- ↓ Art 21. Period Furniture. Two credits. This course is to supercede Art 29a and b.

The following recommendation of the College of Arts and Sciences was approved:

"That Journalism 8b must be completed before credit is given for Journalism 8a, the first semester's work. Journalism 8a and 8b are entitled Copyreading, Editing and Typography. The reason for this is that the course has been designated and outlined to include a full year's work. A student will not be able to get much out of the course by taking only one semester."

(To replace Journalism 6)
- ↓ English 37. Advanced Dramatic Production. Two hours a week; two credits. (To replace English 35).
- ↓ Physics 119. Principles of X-Rays. Three hours a week; three credits.
- ↓ Political Science 255a,b Comparative Government. 2 hours a week. two credits.
