The President called a meeting of the Faculty to take into consideration a petition from eight of the freshmen young men, who were present at the Faculty at their last meeting, and who failed to report for work as then directed. Having learned from Pres. Latterson and Prof. Shackelford that they were dismissed by their own action in accordance with the 3^d resolution of the Faculty at its last meeting, they presented the following petition, viz:-

"We the undersigned respectfully request the Faculty of the A. and M. College to defer the promulgation of their action in regard to our refusal to comply with the requirements made known to us today. We now promise compliance with it and will endeavor to do our duty henceforward, believing in the light of the explanations made that we acted upon a misapprehension of the facts in the case.

One member of the Faculty being necessarily absent till 11 o'clock it was thought best to postpone the further consideration of the petition till that hour. An opportunity was then given to the young men whose names were not on the petition to sign it, but none availed themselves of the opportunity. Mr. J. M. Graham stated that Mr. Mollineaux had requested him (Graham) to have his (Mollineaux's) name removed from the petition. His name was then erased from the petition. On motion the Faculty adjourned till 11 o'clock.

The Faculty met according to adjournment. Since the last meeting of the Faculty Messrs. J. V. Mollineaux, Graham, Mr. Ball, and Lortch came to the Doc. and signed their name to the petition, previously signed by their comrades. Mr. Mollineaux stated that he had not authorized Mr. Graham to have his name withdrawn as he (Graham) stated at 9:15 o'clock. The promise of future good conduct (made in the petition) being understood as a request for the Faculty to rescind its action the 3^d resolution, passed April 17th, it was resolved that the dismissal of each young man be re-considered. Each case was then acted on separately, with the following results:

The dismissals of Messrs. Warwick, Fitzgerald, Lord, Cooper, N. Rogers, J. A. Moore, Sleet, Lamich, J. S. Moore, Proud, Curlee, Ardrey, Mr. Ball, Lortch, and N. L. Barnett were rescinded. Prof. Killigme having asked to be excused from voting on Mr. J. M. Graham's case, and three votes being cast for and three against rescinding his (Graham's) dismissal the Doc. gave his vote against the rescission. The resolution to rescind Mr. Mollineaux's dismissal was lost by one vote. The young men who were dismissed by the Faculty at its meeting 8:45 A. M. April 17th present the following:

We the undersigned do say that we have been laboring under a misapprehension in regard to what was stated to us by the faculty on the morning which we appeared before them" (signed by)

 dismission, announced April 17th, be rescinded and that
 they be allowed to resume all of their duties.
