

A. & M. College of Ky. May 23, 1907.
 The faculty met in the president's office at 3.30 hours present being Pres. Patterson, professors J. G. White, J. H. Nevils, W. K. Patterson, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Pence, Mackenzie, Burt, M. White, Wilson, Tuttle, Grubbs, Rowe and Frankel.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

It was informally agreed that the next meeting of the faculty should be held on Saturday, June 1, at 3 P. M.

The president informed that faculty that Gen. ^{J.} Bell of Washington would probably be the guest of the college during a part of Commencement week, and upon motion of Prof. J. G. White it was ordered that a com. of two, of which Major Burt should be chairman, be appointed to arrange for the proper entertainment of General Bell.

On motion of Major Burt seconded by Prof. J. G. White it was ordered that a com. of three be appointed to take charge of the general arrangements for the Commencement exercises. The president appointed Prof. Mackenzie, Prof. Miller, and professor M. White.

A committee consisting of professors J. G. White and Anderson to prepare and publish the Commencement program.

G. R. Veal.

A letter was read from Mr. G. R. Veal who was suspended in Nov. last for participation in the Hallowe'en disturbances, expressing regret for his share in those disturbances and requesting that he be reinstated at the beginning of the next session.

Upon motion of Prof. Patterson seconded by Prof. Nevils, it was ordered by unanimous vote that Mr. Veal be reinstated in accordance with his request.

Upon nomination of president Patterson and motion of J. G. White, seconded by C. W. Mathews, it was ordered that Gen. J. Franklin Bell, be recommended to the Board of Trustees for the honorary degree of LL.D.

Inasmuch as it was shown that there had been some lapses in the strict enforcement of the rule requiring that seniors in Science and in agriculture shall have no conditions on Jan. 1. of their senior year. to be eligible for graduation in the following June, it was ordered upon motion of C. W. Mathews, that

B. E. Brewer and B. J. Scherffius be considered eligible for the degree of B. S. in Agr. in June, if before commencement they shall have satisfactorily completed all their work.

Upon motion of Prof. James White seconded by Dr. Pryor, it was ordered that with the exception of the Engineering students, beginning with the next session, all seniors to be eligible for graduation in June, must have passed off all conditions by Jan. 1 of their senior year. and after next year ^{in all courses} all conditions must be removed before they be considered eligible to begin their senior year's work.

Upon motion of Prof. Pryor, seconded by Prof. Wilson it was ordered that Prof. V. E. Muncy of Cincinnati be considered eligible for the degree of M.S. in June next, and that the degree be conferred ~~when~~ provided his work is then completed.

Upon motion of Prof. J. G. White it was ordered that the substitution of Chemistry for ^{Other Phys. and astronomy} ~~Calculus~~ in the course of studies pursued by Miss Carmody, be ratified.
