The Faculty met at the usual hour.

Mr. E. C. Barnett asked permission to drop Arithmetic. The case was referred to Profs. Heron and White.

Mr. Potter was allowed to drop Geograph^y.

Mr. Smith reported that students from the College of Arts have been taking some of the fruit from the grounds. The Profs. to whom those young men recite were requested to speak to the young men about the matter.

A communication was read from Dr. Smith, stating that, having examined Mr. J. N. Foster and found that he has a tendency to heart disease, he would recommend that he be excused from drill and hard work.

In accordance with that recommendation Mr. Foster was excused from drill, but was required to hold himself in readiness for light work, whenever called upon. The Faculty then adjourned.

October 25th

The Faculty met as usual.

Messrs. F. L. Smith, Coley, & Febault were reported by Prof. Heron, and Messrs. Huber and Barrow, by Mr. Smith as frequently absent from their classes.

The President was requested to see these gentlemen and require them to attend to their duties. Mr. A. O. Cury was cited to appear in order to answer the charges of being in town the Monday night previous without permission, and of attending the theater. Mr. Enge was also present, charged with breaking his arrest, visiting town without permission and attending the theater. After some explanation by the young men, the charge of attending the theater was dismissed. They acknowledged themselves guilty of the other charges. Mr. Cury's general conduct was reduced 20%. His teachers having stated that he is doing no good in his classes, the Sec. was authorized to write to his guardian requesting his removal from the University. Mr. Enge was privately dismissed.

Messrs. Keite and Normint were publicly dismissed for going away without permission. The following resolution

was then passed, viz: That every student who leaves the University without permission is by so doing dishonorably dismissed from this college. The following communication was received from the Regent:

Messrs. Christian & Bryan asked to be excused from attending chapel service, as they live six miles in the country. They were excused from attending on Sunday afternoon, but not during the week. Mr. J. C. Burns asked to have the action of the Faculty (toward the close of last session) dismissing him from the A. and M. College, reversed.

After some consultation it was decided to refuse his request. The propriety of providing some place where those students who do ^{not} live on the grounds can study by a fire during the hours between their recitations was suggested by Prof. Shackleford. Maj. Tibbitts was authorized to make such arrangement as he should think best.

The Pres. read a letter from Mr. J. N. Foster's father, written to Mr. J. N. F. on receiving a letter from the Pres. requesting him to withdraw his son from college. Mr. J. N. F. promised that if he would be allowed to remain at college he would do anything that the Faculty would require of him. The Sec. was instructed to notify Mr. J. N. F. of the reduction

of his general conduct (made Oct. 14th) and that he would be allowed to attend college as long as he would behave himself. Mr. Foster's request for permission to organize a Latin class was refused. Mr. Barnett asked to be excused from Mr. Smith's class in Eng. Grammar and allowed to enter Capt. Hardinge's. The matter was left to the Prof. of Eng., Capt. H. and Mr. Smith. The Faculty then adjourned.

November 4th The Faculty met as usual.
An honorable discharge was granted to Mr. H. B. Rouse. Mr. Foster asked permission to drop Geography and commence History. The matter was referred to the President & Messrs. Smith & White.
Communications were read from Mrs. Murry, Mrs. Rooks, and Mr. Talbot requesting that their sons be excused from attending worship at the College Chapel on Sunday afternoons. Their requests were granted. Mr. Hefford, was reported by Prof. Munton, and Mr. F. C. Smith, by Prof. Henson as doing very little good in their classes. The President and Abaj. Foberts were requested to represent to the Regent or the Executive Committee the condition of the water and some other matters on the grounds. Mr. A. H. Kalker, having left the college was according to an act passed Oct. 25th publicly dismissed from the Institution.
There being no regular Secretary Mr. Jas. G. White was chosen to act in that capacity for the present session.
There being no further business the Faculty adjourned.
