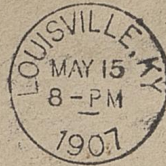
The only time I saw you on the street this week you were "seemingly" very deeply absorbed in a book you had in your hand.

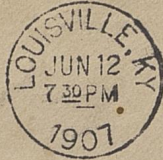
