The faculty met in the President's room  
at 4 pm.

Present: President Patterson, Prof White, Peace  
Board, Mathews, Pryor, Anderson, Brooks, Maj.  
Carpenter.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and  
the called meetings since held were approved.

Ordered on motion of Dr Pryor <sup>that the</sup> communication  
relative to a delegate from the college to attend  
a session of the Biblical Congress to be held  
in Washington D.C. April 17, to 19 be received  
and filed.

Ordered that the resolution, relative to theses, offered  
by Prof Anderson Feb 2, be so amended as to  
read as follows:

Theses for  
graduation

That every candidate for graduation be  
required to submit, for his Bachelor's degree  
a thesis, or exercise, the scope and  
character of which shall be approved by the  
Dean of the course of study in which the  
Candidate is matriculated.

The following communication was read:

"To the faculty of the Kentucky State College,

Kappa Sigma  
Fraternity

We, the undersigned hereby petition the  
faculty of the Kentucky State College to grant  
to the Supreme Executive Committee of the  
Kappa Sigma Fraternity the privilege of  
establishing a chapter in this college.

Referred to a committee composed of the Deans  
with Major Carpenter added.

Rice, Guy W.  
 reduction to ranks  
 Sergeant Guy W. Rice charged with being absent from quarters during study hours without permission, was found guilty by the Board of Discipline and reduced to ranks.

He held that the penalty was too severe and appealed to the faculty.

The finding of the Board of Discipline was sustained by an aye & no vote as follows:

 Anderson, Brooks - 7

No - 0

Major Carpenter not voting.

It was moved by Major Carpenter second by Prof Brooks that non-commissioned cadet officers be reduced to ranks when they <sup>have</sup> 25 demerits in the college or 50 demerits in the dormitory.

The consideration of this motion was adjourned to a meeting to be at the call of the President.
