GLAD TO SEE YOU, HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Last year the University of Kentucky's Athletic Department inaugurated a custom of setting aside one football game each year as a special attraction for Kentucky high school boys and girls. At last year's High School Day more than 5,000 of you came to see the game. It was a real festive occasion and the Wildcats entered into the spirit of the affair, defeating a good Virginia Military Institute football team by 37 to 0.

This year the athletic authorities of the university selected the Washington and Lee game as your special game. The Generals and the Wildcats are time-honored rivals. They have been playing each other in football since way back in 1899, when football was in its infancy. That first game resulted in a tie, but the players were not satisfied, so they agreed to play off the tie. That game was played on Saturday, and the two elevens met again on Monday, Kentucky winning the second game by 6 to 0.

We hope you enjoy the game and we also hope this program appeals to you. Why not keep it as a souvenir? We are quite proud of it.

It is a pleasure to have you with us in such large numbers. No doubt, many of you are future University of Kentucky students; probably some of you are future Wildcat football, basketball, track, tennis or golf stars. The fellow seated next to you may be a future All-American, who knows?

And that girl in the red hat, two rows in front of you, some day may be the sponsor of the Kentucky band or a cheer leader.

Perhaps you don't realize it but this university is your university. You have an interest in it. And, being Kentuckians, the Wildcats are your Wildcats. They are dedicating their services today to you and they want you to come to as many of their games as you can.

We hope that while you are here you have inspected the campus and buildings of the university. There are many interesting things to see. The university is divided into six colleges — Arts and Sciences, Agriculture, Engineering, Law, Education and Commerce—and a Graduate School. This university is the only State owned institution offering advanced degrees. There are approximately 3,500 students in the university.

Dr. Frank L. McVey, one of America's foremost educators, is president of the university.

All the university students, officials and faculty members join in welcoming you boys and girls here today.
