accident, but the Lord so ordered it for
I can better spare it now than then
for my 6 months work ^{which} has been pioneer
work yielding less than 100⁰⁰ inclusive
of travel (50⁰⁰) for 127 services & about
25 professions & other good done.

The Stanford church will soon pay up
all they owe me and call Bro. Slay-
maker I think. I see the fearful
destitutions of our Mts. & wish to do as
much as I can for them, but cant at
the past rate. I have lived on "persim-
mons and past recollections" as said
Dr Robinson of the Virginians

I am contented for God has given
good & raiment & that is all he prom-
ised. But dr. it does not seem

fair to arrears Rowland 10⁰⁰ for
Ky. Cong. work & pay 2000 Sal
ary to a young man like Caldwell.
I can't encourage a ch
& contribute to the fund mana-
ged in that way. The Average Sal
ary in our Ch is not 800⁰⁰ we have
many men able as he that would
go for half the amount & so have
2 men instead of one to preach to
our destitute places! It is
not right before God. No man who
who denies self & preaches as God
calls true ministers to do needs it
unless large families. I am feed-
ing seven & helping a family of
orphans & for 23 years have never
had over 1000⁰⁰. You know how I
preach and I say this in no carp-
ing spirit but for the good of the
cause. No wonder Churches who
have just as able preachers & whom
they only give 800-1000 "kick"
about desiring 100 more to give

some other man 2000⁰⁰. They justly
 feel that other men can as well
 live on 1000 as their pastor. God did
 not mean this to be so. One burdened
 another eased." I write kindly but
 as usual, frankly about what
 many deem a misuse of funds or
 rather a mistake in management
 of Gods substance. Why Rowland has
 never paid over 10⁰⁰ in a year to me
 for preaching to it. And if needed any
 where it needs it now to engage
 Bro. Slaymaker for 1 night a month.
 Then let it give for the destitute Mt.
 but not for an overgrown salary of
 an evangelist or some pastor on the
 sustentation list who gets more
 than their pastor. Now my brother
 Consider this before God. If two men
 can live on 2000 & expenses, ought
 not 2 mens work for perishing souls
 be done & each deny self some of

I only write because I know how
souls are dying - eternally dying &
the Church & Ministry going to heaven
in kids & sick beds! Now I do not
 begrudge a single Comfort to a minis-
ters family, but "to the Cry of lost
souls." One thousand "million souls
dying, dying, dying

In deep and dark despair."

We are put in trust with the Gospel": Dealing
in trust funds for famine stricken souls.

May God enable us to be faithful
& active. I received into Ch. at Jackson
a young professor of the Institute whom
we hope will get preach. Also a ^{Spanish} girl from Letcher, a first fruits to Pres-
byterianism from that Co. I hope to go to
Hyden County Letcher next year where
she lives & try to organize a Ch.

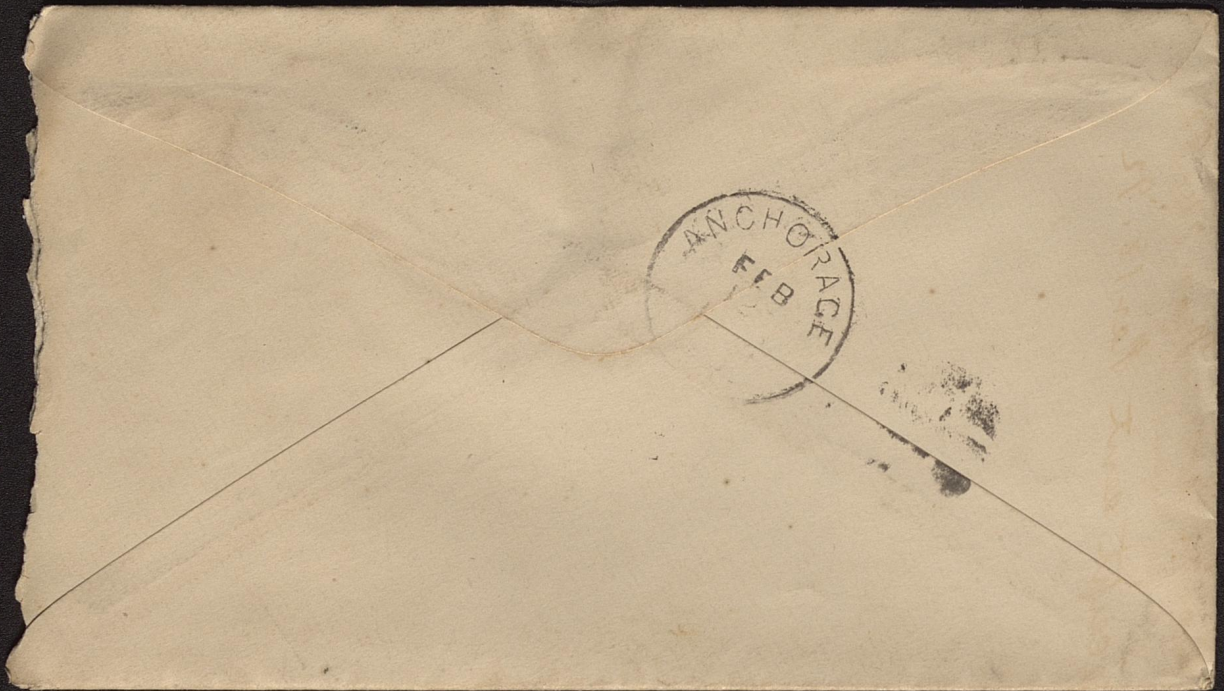

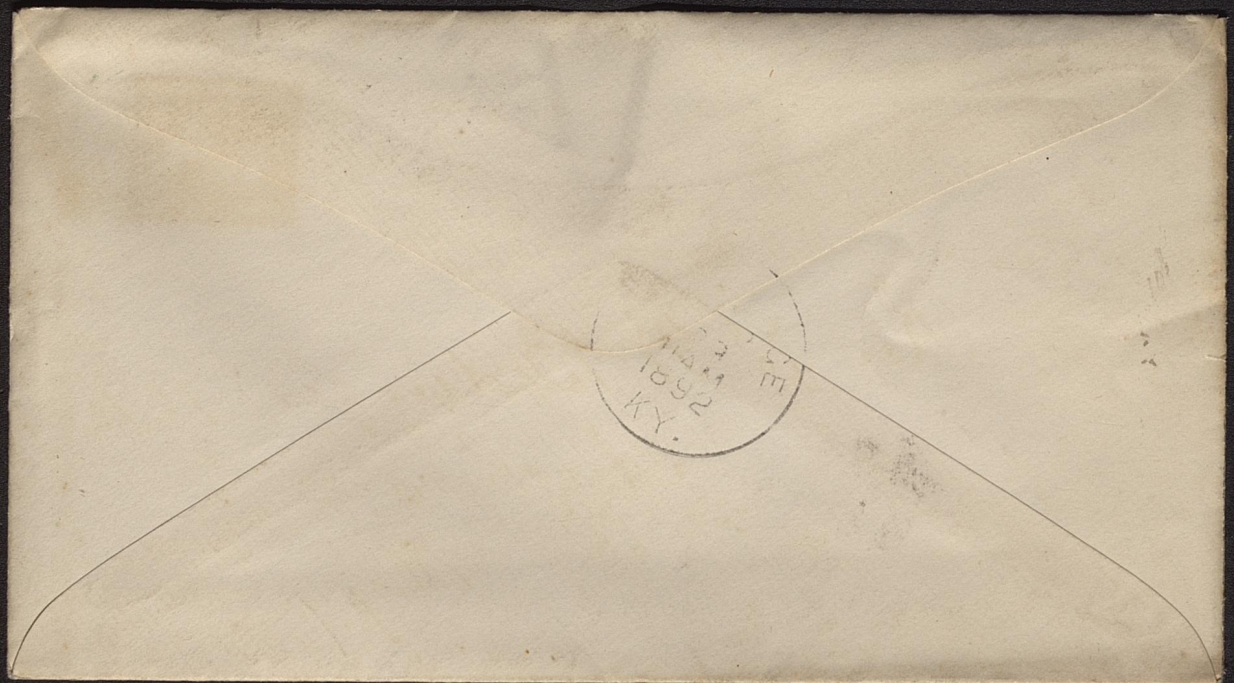

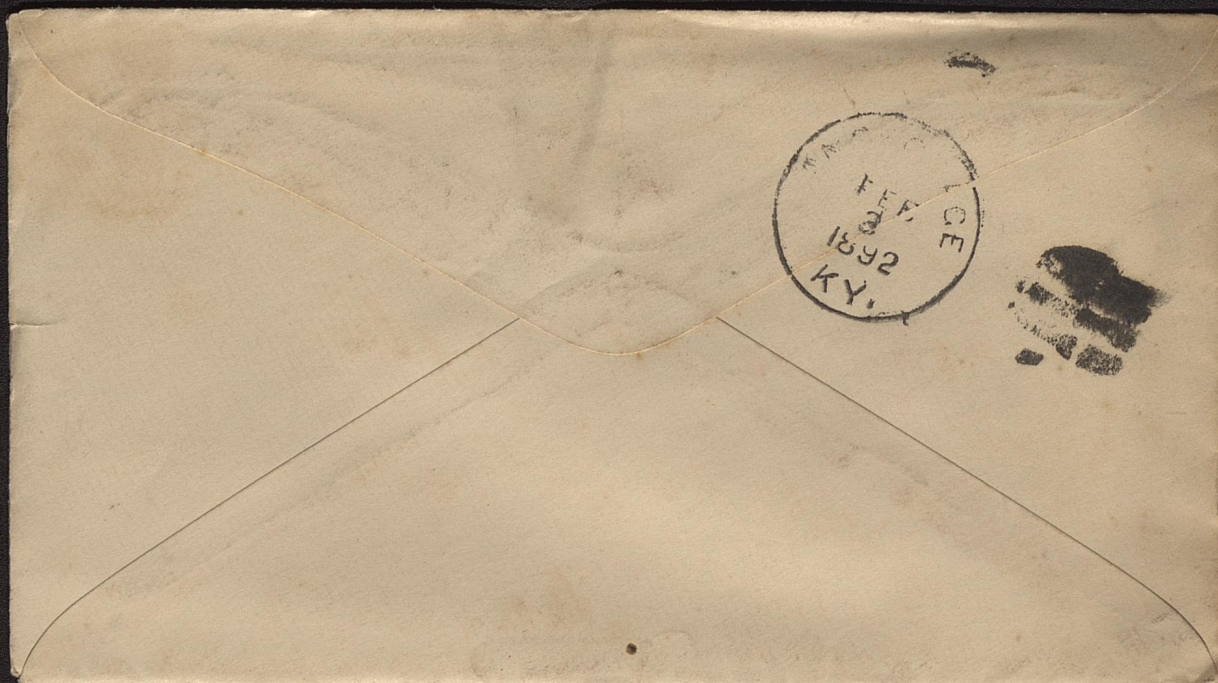

up out of trouble.

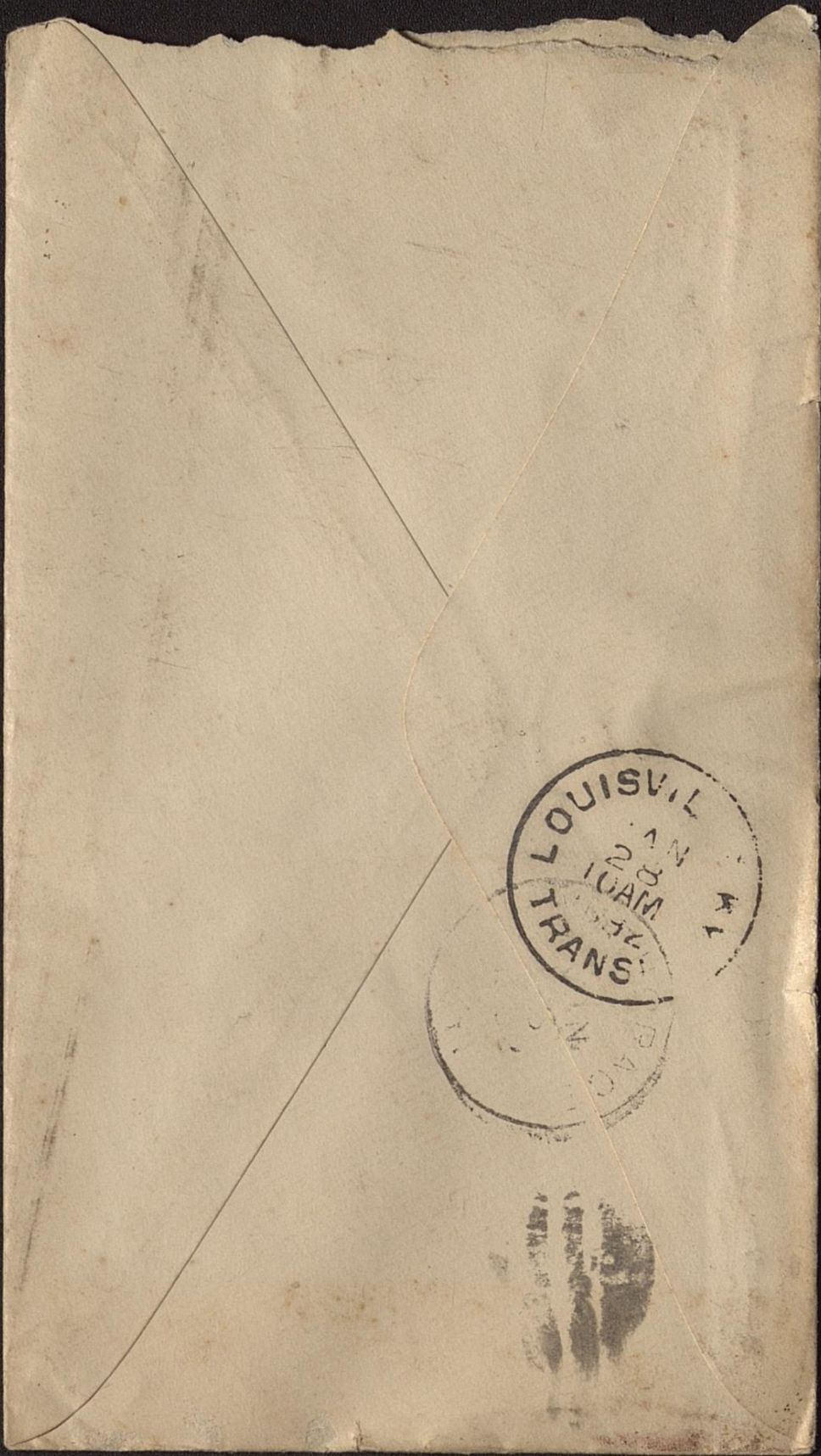

Dear Dr. Keatinger

I am afraid it will be impossible for me to go to Lex. on Friday. The last two days of the week are my sermon days & I try to keep them sacred to preparation for Sunday. The meeting being at noon I have to get up before daylight & get back at bed time — the whole day.

I could not attend the meeting you called in Louisville as I was conducting daily services. Really I was glad of a good excuse for not going. You intimated that one way of cutting down expenses was to discontinue the Hopper & I did not wish to take any part in that action of the Com. I have been so opposed to having him in the Com's employ all the while — & have said so much — that I don't care run to after the matter again. I thought when we met after Synod & our funds were so low that now the Com. wd be forced to leave him off. I was astounded beyond measure when he was continued, but I kept silence. I do not wish to be his judge but I have no

Confidence in his integrity & none in his
work, But I have been compelled to say
so much that I have concluded not to
seem like a persecutor by saying another
word. When the Com. can see its way
clear to drop him I will feel that we are
relieved of an incubus that has been seriously
detrimental to the work.

I am sorry to hear that you have been
sick. I trust both you & your family

Dear Dr. Redinger

After you left I discussed the Ev. work & the proposition to pay our proportion of the debt. Dr. Macken opposed it vigorously & had the sympathy of all the readers & many ministers. There seemed to be only Blanton Witherspoon & myself in favor. I warned the Presbytery that by defeating this proposition they were holding our work down under an incubus that would destroy it - that, if all heartily concurred in the plan, we could pay off the debt, but if we were not unanimous it could not be done - it would not accomplish the end for a few of the churches to make an effort & the rest do nothing. Dr. Macken then withdrew his opposition & let the resolution pass but his opposition had already inflicted a fatal blow. We hardly feel that it was of any use to try the experiment. Still, we must do what we can & I will say this, that while Hoppen

is working in Pennsylvania if you let
him work to this point, saying the \$450,
I believe we will raise it. I saw
him this morning & urged him to
make this his one purpose till he
left the Club on Sat of it. He
said he would if you approved
& believed he could do it. He will
be at Lawrenceburg next week.
