I have just returned from a trip to Breathitt Co. I spent about two weeks on that work. Considering all difficulties with which we have had to contend, it seems to me that the work is doing quite well. Now as Breathitt has a R. R. the work will progress much better than ever before.

I will here offer a suggestion. St. Helens - now called Three Forks City - has no organized church, is on the N. O. R. R. can be reached with in less than two hours from Jackson when R. R. is com-

pleted to that point, has a population now of about 4000 and is growing rapidly. I think we should organize a church there. I had a talk with a physician of that town and a member of the Presbyterian Church. He thinks there is a good opening for a church there if we will only make an effort.

Brothers Mickel, Jas. M. Little, and myself will hold protracted meetings at all the churches on this work, beginning about 1st. of July.

Hope you will visit the work during the summer.

I fear Bro. Mickel will leave the work soon. If he should it would be a great loss to the field. He

is a most excellent preacher and is very popular with the people.

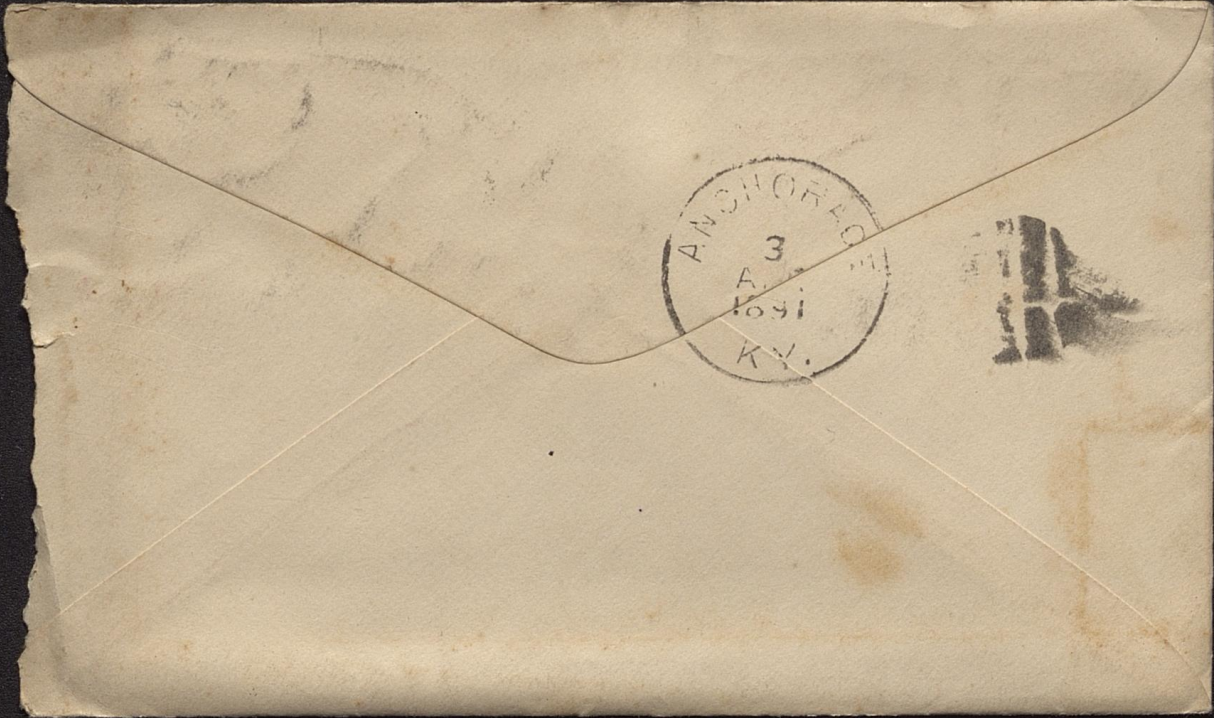

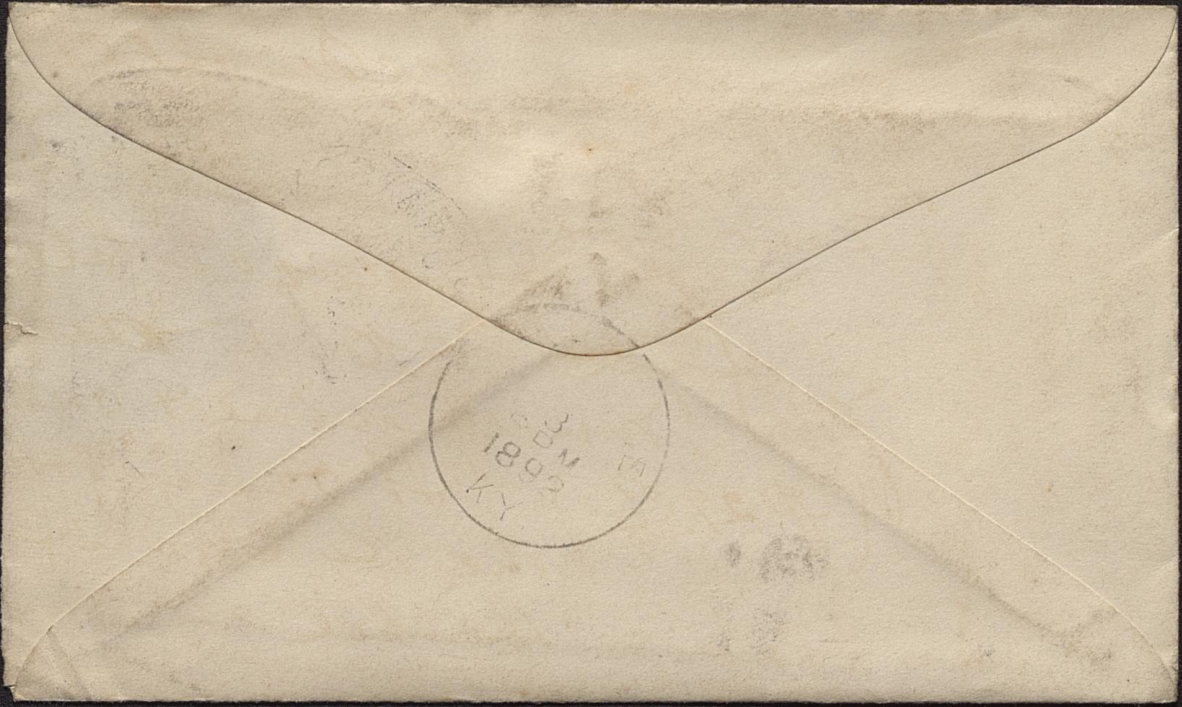

Dear Brother:-

I received your letter, containing thanks, some time ago. I am satisfied Grayson will pay her apportionment. I will make an earnest effort to get \$5.00 at O. H.

I am sorry you were driven to the necessity of cutting ^{down} appropriations. The prospect for my support in this field looks quite gloomy at this time. It looked so last year, and I failed to get support from appropriation and the field, but I had a small surplus which

I used and was thus enabled to close the year without debt. I have no surplus for this year. If I should be able to close this year without debt, I should be much surprised. I have used every means to get monthly contributions to my support. I have done the work of both Elder and Deacon. I have succeeded in getting subscriptions to the amount \$100.00 at O.H., and about \$180.00 at Grayson. I have written Dr. Guernant to know if he can make one more visit to this field. I would like to have him hold a meeting at O.H. and at Willard about twelve miles from this place on the E. K. R.R. Willard is a village

of about 300 inhabitants. They have the best school in Carter Co. and only one church building - Baptist. I believe there could be a Presbyterian Church organized at that place. If you can not send Dr. Guernant can you not send some other evangelist to assist me in a meeting at these places?

I hope you may have an opportunity to visit this field soon.

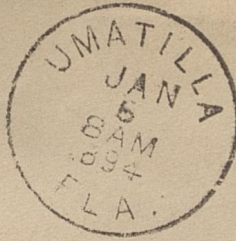
