The faculty met in regular monthly session in the President's office at 3.30 P. M.

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Elegibility of
Seniors for
degrees, Condi-
tions of.

Prof. Anderson seconded by Prof. Kastle
moved; - that no Senior shall be considered
eligible to receive his Bachelor's degree who shall
have any condition in any subject, at the beginning
of the third term of his Senior year. Carried.

Com. on promo-
tions in Cadet
Corps.

President Patterson called attention to the
necessity, as in previous years, for a Committee on
promotions in the cadet corps. and he appointed
as that committee the Deans of the several courses
of study and Prof. Patterson, the principal of the
Academy. with Prof. J. G. White as Chairman.

Athletics - Con-
ditions of accept-
ance upon foot-
ball teams.

The President also spoke of the qualifications
required of candidates for positions upon the foot-
ball team; that there should be satisfactory
evidence that they are bona fide matriculates
of the College for the entire year; that no profes-
sional player, and no other person entering for
a money consideration or other emoluments,
should be admitted to the college.

Athletics - Coop-
eration with other
Colleges to debar
professionalism

He suggested that the Athletic Committee
of the College should open communications with
the authorities of other colleges in the state with
a view to the debarring of all professionalism
and eliminating the practice of securing foot-ball
and other players by any pecuniary consideration
or its equivalent.

Harvard regula-
tions in Athletics.

Prof. A. M. Miller seconded by Dr. Pryor
moved that the Harvard regulations applying to
Athletics be adopted by this College as follows; -
"No student shall be allowed to represent
the State College in any public athletic contest
who either before or since entering the college
shall at any time have received, for taking
part in any athletic sport or contest, any
pecuniary gain or emolument whatever, direct or
indirect, with the single exception, that he
may have received from the college organization
or any permanent amateur association of which
he was at that time a member, the amount
by which the expenses necessarily incurred by
him in representing his organization in athletic

costs exceeded his ordinary expenses."

Athletics, Har-
vard rule adopt-
ed.

Prof. Anderson offered the following amendment which was accepted by the mover of the original motion and his second, - "that the Harvard rule relative to athletics be adopted as applicable to the State College of Ky. and that a committee of three from this faculty be appointed to cooperate with the faculties of the other educational institutions of the state for the purpose of putting our athletic affairs on the same basis as obtains between Yale, Harvard, and Princeton Universities"
