Committee on Post-grad. Deg.
President Patterson called the attention of the Faculty to the matter of class-marching. Mr. J.P. Nelson read a resolution (No. 12, file B) to the effect that a committee be appointed by the President to report at the next regular meeting as to post-graduate degrees. The resolution prevailed, and the President appointed Messrs. White, Nelson, Roark, Neville, Anderson, Keath, Garman, and Mathews as the committee.
