



THE APPALACHIAN TRAIL ON THE PISGAH AND CHEROKEE NATIONAL FORESTS

This portion of the Trail for most of its length (192 miles) follows the North Carolina and Tennessee state line. Much of the route is rugged and steep. This is one of the highest and most rugged segments of the entire Appalachian chain. It features many panoramic views from elevated clear summits of the "Balds." It also features a profusion of flowering plants which are in their height of bloom during June and early July.

Red and yellow paint blazes delineate Wildlife Management Area boundaries and should not be confused with Trail markers.

A hiker should not proceed more than 1/4 mile without marking a Trail marker. Also, always depend on the Trail marking rather than this map. Changes of location often are made in the Trail. Watch for the double blaze and sign.
