Prof. Castle called the attention of the faculty to the fact that the grades of students as reported by some professors to the college registrar are frequently presented to her in such form as to make her work unnecessarily laborious. The discussion which followed this statement showed that the diverse methods of keeping and reporting grades is due largely to a want of understanding as to what method should be pursued. On motion of J. G. White a committee was appointed to recommend to the faculty a plan of keeping and reporting grades which can be followed by all professors in this college. President Patterson appointed Prof's White, Castle and Roark on this committee. On motion the faculty adjourned.
