What Next?

There is pathetically little campus activity life at the University of Kentucky.

This may seem Ble a strange statement in view of hundreds of campus organizations in existence. The old UK saw about the campus being "overorganized" is true in a sense, but only in a superficial sense.

The fact is that the campus is crowded with clubs and honoraries. But practically every one off-them is just going through he motions, with no real enthusiasm or interest on the part of the members, who may have joined for many and varying reasons. Too few of them have any purpose. And those that do, or could have, are too feeble to achieve anything.

Look at one of the top organizations on the campus, the Strodent Government Association.

It could, and should, be the key organization, the originator of new, helpful plans for the campus, the discoverer of solutions to old campus problems, and the means through which the large student body could be drawn together in support of ideas or corrections they need and want.

Is it? Far from it.

Its suggestions, when it used to make suggestions, have been coll-shouldered, often as not. Its funds, coming from an addition to student fees for the specific purpose of supporting SGA, are now incorporated into University funds about which SGA has little to say. For instance, if SGA suggests new registration processes, it's turned aside with around-the-bush statements. If it wants to appropriate enough money to send a student to Europe, it can't without University approval, which this year was not forthcoming.

Take another big organization move hamstrung, largely through the removal of control from student hands. Suky, once a lively, hustling group, is now a farce.

The list could go on and on.

A major addition to it was made Tuesday night, when the other empty, figurehead organizations moved over to make room for the Interfraternity Council.

The Council had to sit idly by, without a word, and see an administrative disciplinary group make a drastic example of a fraternity.

Even though the University is as fair as possible in its dealings with students, why should such functionless organizations stay in existence when actually they are only dummies with no authority and little influence?

Student campus activity life has a dangerously low pulse these years. By taking the initiative, the control, the responsibility from student hands, the school has run the risk of removing also the zest, the enjowment, the enthusiasm and interest.

As the campus organizations have become more and more moribund, about the last remaining element of color and life has been the sorority-fraternity element.

When engoachment on their initiative is complete, the few remaining campus functions of interest will become as forced as the pep rallies, and as artificial as the cooked-up "College Night," designed to encourage freshmen about the gaiety of college living.

Wise Stand On Negro Issue

In not appealing the Federal Court's decision permitting Negroes to enter UK's Graduate school, and in accepting Ne-groes in the Colleges of Pharmacy, Law, and Engineering, the University has acted sensibly and highly commendably. The standards on this most controversial question is one for which UK students can be rightfully proud of their University.
