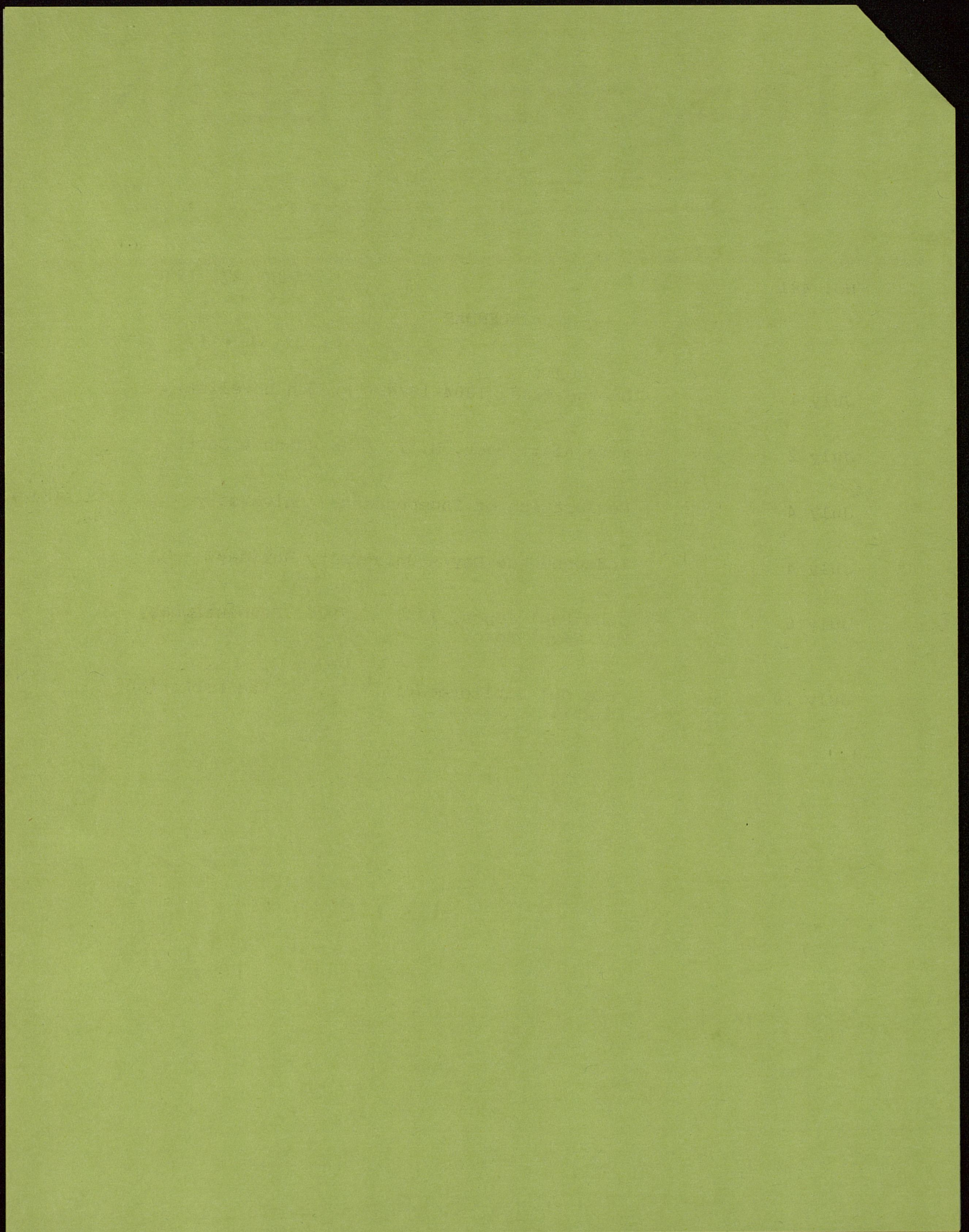

There seems to be an unfortunate resurgence of censorship in our "liberated" times. This problem has been around a long time. July 11 "celebrates" Bowdler's Day. Thomas Bowdler was a British physician, born near Bath, England on July 11, 1754. He left his first calling, medicine, to clear up the language in Shakespeare's plays. He removed all words and expressions he felt to be indecent or impious, or "which cannot with propriety be read aloud in a family." He didn't stop with Shakespeare. In fact, he also censored the Old Testament and History of the Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire by Edward Gibbon. His censorship was so offensive that his name became synonymous with self-righteous expurgation that it has become a part of our language.
