

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE.

May 9, 1927.

The University Senate met in the Little Theatre, Monday May 9, with President McVey presiding.

The minutes of March 31 were read and approved.

There was some discussion as to the question of teachers' retirement insurance. This question was referred to the committee consisting of Professor Wiest as Chairman, Leland, LeSturgeon, Olney, McMullen.

The following recommendation of the Rules Committee was approved:

"At the close of each semester and of each term of the summer session, those in charge of any department shall post lists of students who are delinquent in their financial obligations to the University and shall notify these delinquents, and shall send the lists to the Registrar. No student will be allowed credit for his semester's or term's work, not to register for the next semester or term, nor to graduate, until all such obligations have been satisfactorily met.

"This matter was referred back to the Committee on Rules at the last meeting of the Senate. The committee does not think it wise to include in this rule such organizations as the Y. M. C.A."

The Senate approved the petition of the members of the Classical Club to petition Eta Sigma Phi, national honorary fraternity for students in Latin and Greek, for a charter authorizing the establishment of a chapter in the University of Kentucky.

The following recommendations from the College of Law were approved:

- ✓ Civil Procedure 11. - four credits, second semester, 1926-1927 (instead of three).
- ✓ Equity 11 - three credits, second semester 1926-27 (instead of two).
- ✓ Negotiable Instruments - three credits, second semester 1926-1927 (instead of two).
- ✓ Evidence - three credits, second semester 1926-27 (instead of four).
- ✓ Constitutional Law - four credits, second semester 1926-27 (instead of three)

That for the session of 1927-28 the course in Evidence be divided into Evidence 1, two hours a week, first semester, two credits, and Evidence 11, two hours a week, second semester, two credits.

- ✓ 1926-27 Domestic Relations, three credits instead of two.
- ✓ Legal Research, three credits instead of two.
