January 17th The Faculty met at the usual hour. Sec. of Faculty. Permission was granted Mr. Harbert to change his lodging. Gillis and Mattison were reported for absenting themselves two weeks or more after the expiration of their furloughs. They gave satisfactory reasons for one week but had no excuse for the rest of the time. The Sec. was directed to write to Gillis' father requesting the immediate removal of his son. Mattison having promised to discharge his duties faithfully in future if allowed to remain, it was resolved that he be placed on probation for a month, that he be privately reprimanded by the Pres., and that his general conduct be reduced to 75. Mr. Bailey was allowed to withdraw, his connection with the College having been so short that the Faculty did not feel justified in granting an honorable discharge. Ramsay was reported for frequent absence of late, from his classes. He was required to attend his duties more faithfully. His general conduct was reduced 50%.
