

Baltimore 15 March 1836

My dear Sir,

I have received your favor of the 11<sup>th</sup> inst with the enclosure from Gen Shelby; you will do as you please regarding the Broken Horn Case, or if it would suit you better she may go into the agreement with them you saw how to breed or show which would make four heifers instead of four, as she has not taken the bull since we saw her & presume she is of course in Capt. Crizimby

I observed you have concluded to take half interest in the sea oxen impounded in the American at the rate of 3000\$ for the whole or 1500\$ for the half to which I consent and shall merely charge the amount to the debit of your account or Cash in point of interest on the 1<sup>st</sup> inst on which day it is tenanted your ~~interest~~ <sup>property</sup> in their Company, and when the thing can be settled it is perfectly convenient for you to pay the amount, the same will be done, for the cost of the Broken Horn Case should you decide to take her on your own account
