

Millwood June 3^d 1845

My Dear Sir,

Mr. Hackaday left Columbia yesterday, having in charge Margaret Woods, the Bay Filly you saw in my stable, by Priam out of Maria West. This filly seemed to strike your fancy, & I have ventured to send her on to you, & earnestly hope you will accept her, as a token of my regard. To me she is of but little value, having her dam still breeding, her half sister Fanny besides others of the same family. My only regret is, that the offering is so entirely unworthy your acceptance; or the feelings that prompt me to tender it you.

She was foaled in 1820; at 3 yrs old she won the Trial stakes at Nashville, & was then considered a very promising filly, but like all her stable companions that accompanied her to the west, she was utterly ruined by the trip. She has been put to Aurald, & I hope may prove in foal.

P.S. Mr. Hackaday resides in Georgetown Ky. & has promised me to send M.W. over to you.
