I had supposed his pedigree in manuscript and his

Yorkshire has had quite a barren field here in
which to distinguish himself as a breeder of race
horses - having had but few males bred to him of
pure blood - Major Marshall of Lewis County bred
a fine Natter Mare to him and got a colt which
has eminently distinguished himself - having won several
races losing none as I am informed - This is the only
colt of his, which has been trained
