Cadet D.D. Slade, and C.C. Clarke appeared before the faculty, charged with playing foot-ball in violation of a regulation which provides that a certain class standing shall be maintained as a condition of eligibility.

After a statement from Prof. Roark chairman of the Athletic Committee and statements from the young men accused, Prof. White offered the following:

Resolves that cadets Slade and Clarke be suspended for two weeks, from college duties and privileges, and that they be forbidden to participate in athletic games during the remainder of this ^{collegiate} year, and that their parents be notified of this action.

Carried.

Ordered that a committee of three of which Prof. Shockford shall be one be appointed to super-intend all public literary exercises ^{in which students participate} during the remainder of this year, and that the President be made, Ex-officio, Chairman of this committee, and that the committee have the power to call ⁱⁿ any other members of the faculty for assistance.
