

December 20th The Faculty met at the usual hour.

Furloughs, were granted to Messrs ^{10 days} Holmes, Ballard ^{Feb. 1st 1872.}
^{Dec. 25th} Burnett and ^{Dec. 23rd} Bristol. An honorable discharge
 was granted to Martin. Messrs. Ellison and Cooper
 were excused from Arithmetic. Cooper asked per-
 mission to work at "The Lexington Daily Press" office
 in the afternoon. As the Faculty have no jurisdiction
 in such a case, the President was requested to refer
 the case to the Executive Committee.

Ford having twice gone "beyond the immediate
 precincts of Lexington or Ashland", "without permission
 of the Faculty" was privately dismissed. J. R. Frazer
 presented a letter from his father asking that his son
 be excused from Sunday-afternoon service. It was
 resolved that no action be taken till instructions on
 that case matter be obtained from the Ex. Committee.

A committee consisting of Pres. Patterson, Maj. Luxton,
 and Prof. Shackelford was appointed to investigate
 the condition of affairs at the Yacht Club.

This committee was authorized to disband the club
 if they think best. A letter was read from H.
 W. Bowman from whose room J. Lovell professed to have
 obtained all of the cartridges which he has had.

The letter, however, threw no light upon the case referred
 mentioned under date Nov. 21st. The committee consisting
 of the Pres., Prof. Shackelford, and Maj. Luxton was
 also requested to investigate this case as far as possible
 and report at the next meeting. The Pres. was
 requested to write to the Regent in regard to the general
 conduct of the boys who board at his house.

The janitor was admonished that he would
 be discharged if he did not discharge his
 duties more faithfully. The Faculty then adjourned.
