have a number of letters of commendation from his superiors in the Armed Forces and he is now successfully pursuing studies at Eastern.


This petition is concurred in by the Testing Bureau and by the University Registrar.

In discussing the fact that duplicate copies of the list of candidates for degrees were not available for the Faculty, it was agreed, that in the future, candidates would be considered at a later meeting of the Faculty, either the March meeting a week or two later than the regular February meeting.

John Bondurant, Chairman of Religion in Life Week, appeared before the Faculty and requested that those who had not returned the forms asking for speakers, try to get them in by the end of the week if possible.

Dean White presented a recommendation from the College of Arts and Sciences that the Department of Anthropology be authorized to offer Anthropology 1 by television to resident students who will enroll for it as a regular class. After some discussion this recommendation was approved by the Faculty.

Dean Wall presented from the College of Agriculture and Home Economics a request for approval of a new course, which was approved by the Faculty.

To: Members of the University Faculty

The College of Agriculture and Home Economics is submitting the following for your consideration as a new course in Home Economics:

H. E. 56 WORKSHOP IN CHILD GUIDANCE (3) S

Theories and practices of guiding your children in various situations, including study of program, space and equipment, creative material, music and science possibilities for young children. This workshop is planned to meet the educational needs of persons employed during the regular school year in private and church-sponsored schools that enroll children aged two through four years. Lecture and recitation 10 hours per week, laboratory 15 hours per week.

Duration: Three weeks, including a total of 30 hours lecture and discussion and 45 hours laboratory.


Dean Spivey presented a recommendation from the Graduate Council that honorary degrees be awarded to two men at the June Commencement. These are:

Philip R. Edwards, Bacteriologist, the degree of Doctor of Science; W. Hugh Peal, Lawyer, the degree of Doctor of Laws.

The University Faculty voted to recommend Mr. Edwards and Mr. Peal to the Board of Trustees for honorary degrees as indicated. Dean Spivey called attention to the necessity for keeping these awards confidential until after the Board of Trustees had taken action and the recipients had accepted.

President Dickey presented a letter from the Committee on Religion in Life Week, to be held March 1 to 5, requesting permission to hold an all-University convocation at 10:00 a.m., Monday, March 2, at Memorial Coliseum. A motion to approve the request was amended to have the convocation held in the evening. The amended motion was adopted.

Upon Motion the University Faculty adjourned at 4:50 p.m.
