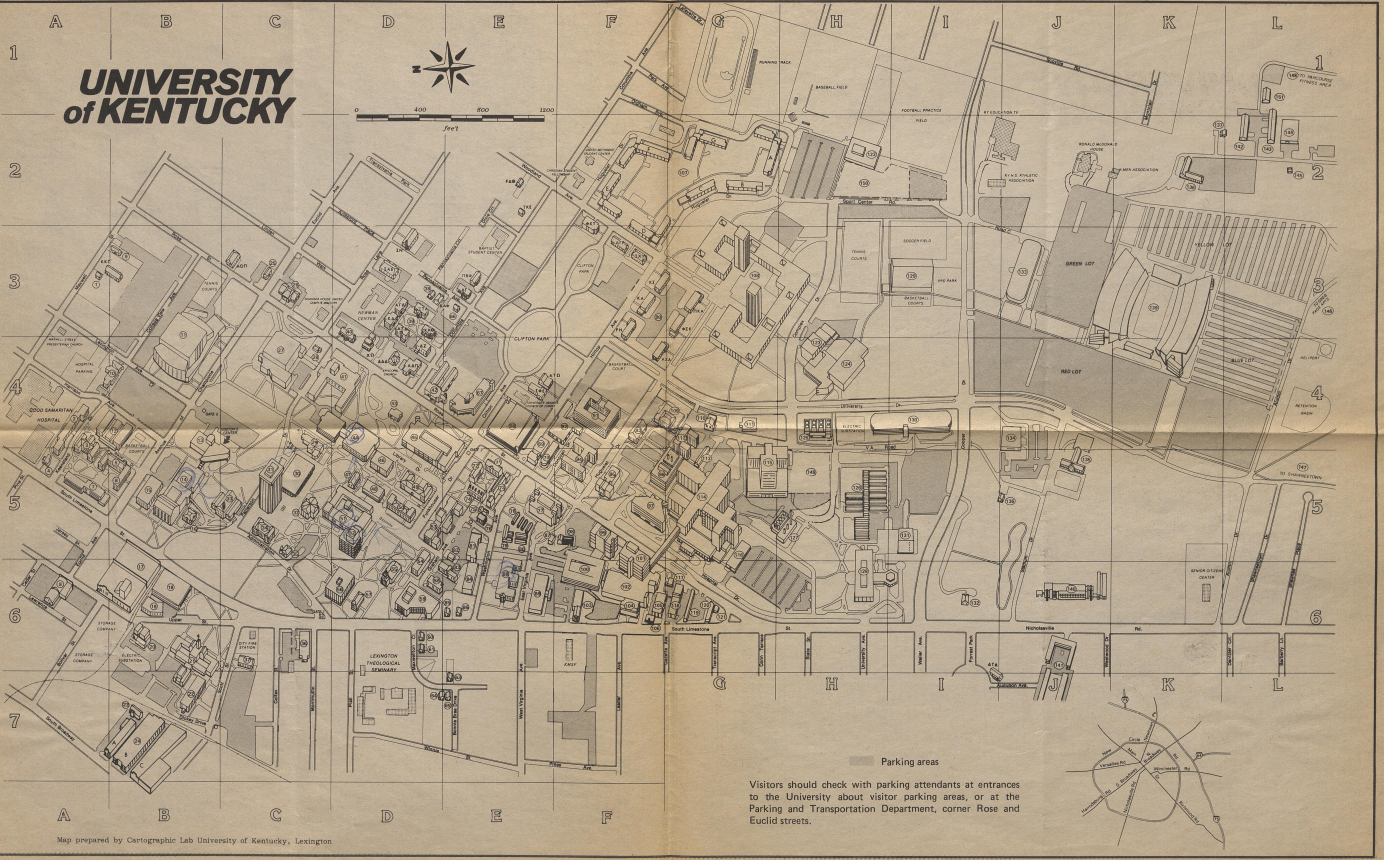

## Some Facts About the University

### History and Governance

The University of Kentucky was founded in 1795 under the provisions of the Morrill Land-Grant Act.

For the first 40 years, enrollment remained small, but by the turn of the century the University was becoming one of the most important institutions in the state.

UK took its present name in 1916 and at the same time assumed the responsibility for being the state's principal institution for teaching, research and service.

The University of Kentucky is governed by a 20-member Board of Trustees.

David Roselle became the ninth president of the University of Kentucky on July 1, 1987.

### The Campus

The University of Kentucky's 716-acre campus is located just south of downtown Lexington, Ky., which has a population of more than 200,000.

### Academic Program

The University of Kentucky has 17 academic colleges. They are: Arts and Sciences . . . Agriculture . . . Engineering . . . Business and Economics . . . Education . . . Home Economics . . . Library and Information Sciences . . . Social Work . . . Architecture . . . Communications . . . Fine Arts . . . Law . . . Medicine . . . Dentistry . . . Nursing . . . Allied Health Professions . . . Pharmacy.

On the graduate level, 75 programs lead to the master's degree and 48 to the doctorate in The Graduate School.

### Research

The University of Kentucky library system contains more than 2 million volumes and ranks 17th in the nation in microform holdings.

The University receives more than \$45 million in research and sponsored program funds each year. Among the major areas of research at the University of Kentucky are engineering, medical (especially cancer research and research on the aging) and agriculture (especially in tobacco and equine research), computational sciences, membrane science, materials science, biomedical engineering and biotechnology.

### Faculty

UK's full-time faculty numbers 1,509 on the Lexington campus and the Medical Center, including a graduate faculty of about 950.

### Admissions and Enrollment

Admission to the University of Kentucky is offered to students who demonstrate the ability to compete in an academically demanding environment. Students will be admitted automatically if they have no previous college work and their standardized test scores (ACT or SAT), high school grades and curriculum predict successful academic performance as UK freshmen. Notices of acceptance to UK are sent to students on a continuous basis throughout the school year.

Approximately 20 percent of the UK freshman class will be selected from applicants who do not meet the requirements for automatic acceptance. In addition to standardized test scores, grades, and high school curriculum, the Admissions Office will consider such factors as extracurricular activities, out-of-class accomplishments, personal achievement, and the geographic region in which the student lives. Admissions decisions for delayed applicants are usually made after February 15.

### Tuition and Financial Aid

The 1987-88 undergraduate tuition is \$706 per semester for residents of Kentucky and \$2,026 for non-

residents. Room and board for the school year ranges from \$2,218 to \$2,632 depending on the meal plan chosen.

More than 50 percent of UK's students receive financial aid which amounts to some \$35 million annually.

### Student Body

Enrollment on UK's Lexington campus totals about 21,000 from every Kentucky county, from 49 other states and the District of Columbia and from 87 foreign countries.

About 5,300 students live in UK's residence halls. About 3,300 UK students belong to fraternities and sororities and a large number of members live in the residences of these groups.

### Alumni

The University has 94,000 alumni around the world with 25,000 paid members of UK's National Alumni Association, including 7,900 life members. There are 63 alumni clubs across the nation, with 33 of them in Kentucky and 30 outside the state from California to New York.

### Athletics

In athletics, UK has a total of 20 sports — 10 men's and 10 women's sports — competing on the highest level of national collegiate competition.

The Wildcat basketball team plays in the downtown Lexington Civic Center's Rupp Arena under the direction of Coach Eddie Sutton. UK has won five NCAA championships, two NCAA runner-up trophies, two NIT winning trophies, and 36 SEC championships.

Wildcat football teams play in the 58,000-seat Commonwealth Stadium on campus and in recent years have won two bowl games and shared in an SEC championship. The team is coached by UK alumnus Jerry Claiborne.

### Community Colleges

The 14 Community Colleges in Kentucky are an important part of the University of Kentucky. These two-year colleges, scattered across the state, offer the first two years of the baccalaureate program, an associate technical degree, and a wide variety of continuing education and community service programs. Enrollment at the community colleges statewide is more than 25,000 students.

### Medical Center

UK's Albert B. Chandler Medical Center has a wide range of programs in education and research. The five colleges—Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing, Pharmacy and Allied Health Professions—have more than 2,000 students pursuing bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in health-related fields.

The Medical Center also has the 461-bed University Hospital as part of its teaching and service programs.

### What to See

Free guided bus tours are conducted at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m., weekdays from the Visitor Center located in the UK Student Center. Saturday tours are at 1 p.m., September through April only. Special group tours may be arranged by calling 606-257-3595.

The UK Art Museum, located in the West Wing of the Singletary Center for the Arts at the corner of Rose Street and Euclid Avenue, is open daily except Mondays and University holidays from noon to 5 p.m.

The UK Museum of Anthropology is open Mondays through Fridays from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. It is located in Lafferty Hall on the campus. A cultural history of Kentucky is one of the featured exhibits.

Visitors to the UK campus may also want to take advantage of the breathtaking view of Lexington and the University campus from the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on campus. It is open from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Mondays through Fridays.
