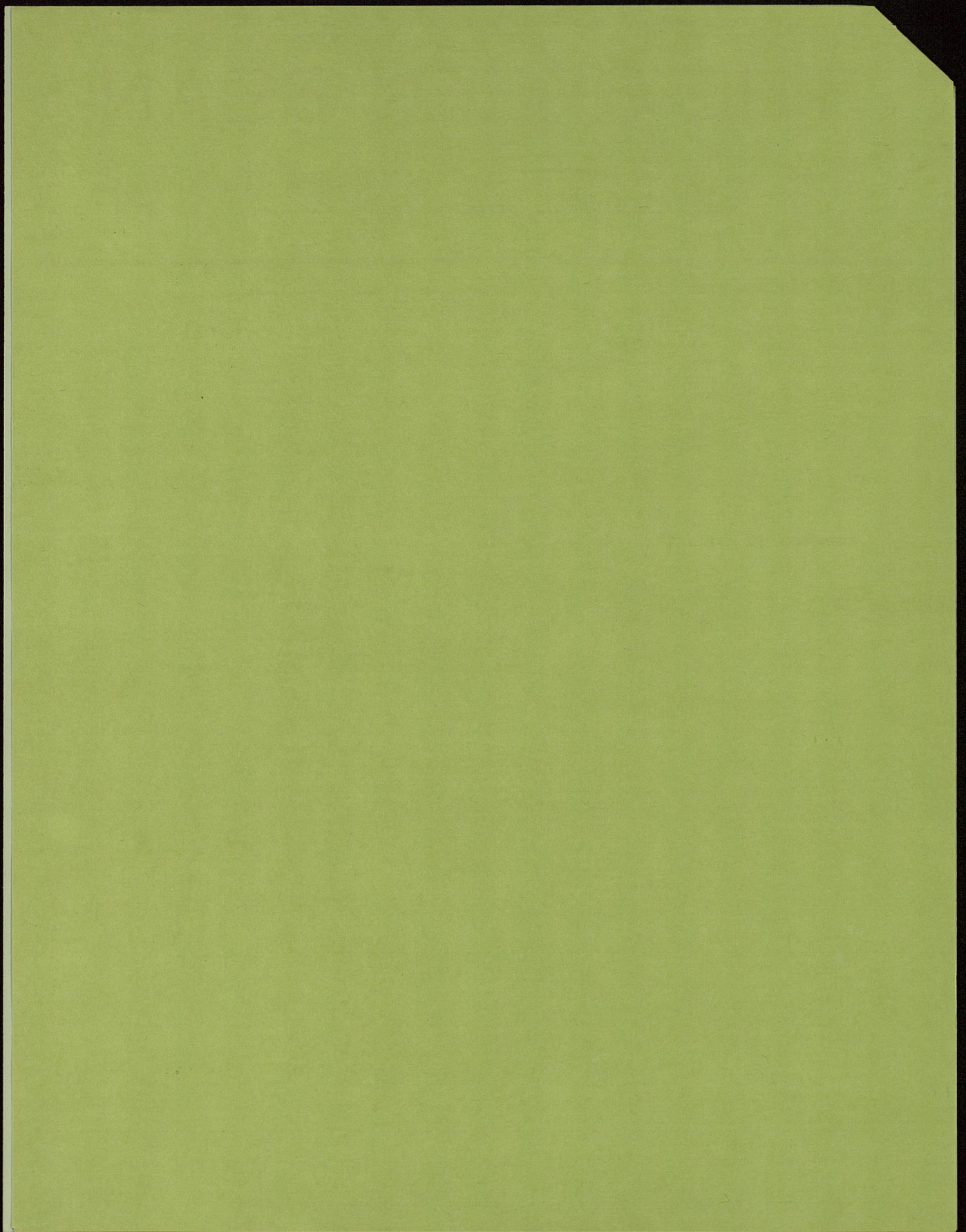

END-USER SERVICES

SPEC KIT #122, "End-User Searching Services," has been received in the Reference Dept. in King South. While online searching has been an accepted reference service for years, it is only recently that we have become involved in instructing the patron, the end-user, how to do his or her own searching.

Researchers contacted 23 (primarily) ARL Libraries in 1985 and surveyed them on the following: planning and implementation, types of support programs, evaluation, trends and needs. The kit was prepared by Sarah E. Thomas, Chief, Technical Services Division of the National Agriculture Library.
